George Maxwell V. on Judgment Bond  
vs John Martensen Judgment of Nonsum Informata

Charles County ss. John Martensen late of Charles County Planter otherwise  
called John Marten of Charles County Planter was summoned to answer unto  
George Maxwell Esq. that he owes unto him the just and full sum of Ninety five  
pounds and two pence Sterling which to him he does and truly justly detains

And whereupon the said George Maxwell by Thomas Clark his Attorney saith that  
whereas the said John on the Thirtieth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven  
hundred and forty six at Charles County ss. by his certain Writing obligatory with the Seal of  
him the said John sealed and herein Court produced whose date is the day and year afo.  
acknowledged himself to be bound and firmly bound unto the said George in the said sum of  
Ninety five pounds and two pence Sterling to be paid to the said George when thereunto  
afterwards he should be requested Nevertheless the said John at the often request of the  
sum of Ninety five pounds and two pence Sterling or any part thereof to him the said Geo.  
hath not paid or in any sort contented but the same to him the said George to pay or in any  
sort to content hath hither to altogether refused and still doth refuse to the Damage of the  
the said George one Hundred pound Sterling and therefore suit is brought

And the said John by Jeremiah Chase his Attorney comes and appears the force and  
Injury when he pray a hearing of the Writing obligatory and it is read unto him  
he also pray a hearing of the condition of the same Writing and it is read unto him in the words

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound John make  
do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said George Maxwell his  
certain Attorney Esq. a sum of Forty seven pounds Ten Shillings  
and one penny Sterling at or upon the first day of June Next ensuing the date hereof  
Legal Witness for the same then the above obligation to be void Else to remain in full force  
and virtue in Law but if he fail herein in the payment of the said sum of Forty seven pound  
Ten Shillings and one penny Sterling then I empower any Attorney in any Court of Record  
in the Realm of Great Britain France or Ireland or within the provinces of Maryland  
or other his Majesty's Dominions to appear for me at the suit of the above mentioned Geo.  
Maxwell and to receive a declaration on the above obligation and thereupon to Conclude  
Judgment by Nilai et Cognovit et aliorum, Nonsum Informata or otherwise  
hath by Releasing all the Errors that may happen upon the said Judgment being out  
Execution thereupon or in any of the proceedings thereunto relating
