Thereupon the said Elizabeth Smalls present here in Court as aforesaid being asked whether she be guilty of Premises above on her Imposed Saith that she is the roff guilty In manner and form as against her it is alledged.

Therefore it is considered by that the said Elizabeth be fined six Hundred pounds of Tobacco or thirty Shillings Current Money for her Offence aforesaid by the Court here Judged according to the first Clause and Article of the Act of Assembly in such Cases late made and Provided and that the said Elizabeth betaken

Whereupon Into Court here In his proper pers on comes Robert Yates of Charles County Gent. and becomes Pledge and Security for the said Elizabeth to pay the fine aforesaid as also the several fees arise due to the Officers and Ministers of the Court here by Occasion of the Premises.

Ruled that the said Elizabeth Smalls

Recognize in the Sum of Ten pounds Current Money with sufficient Surety in the like Sum for her Appearance here on the Second Tuesday in June next to Testifye for the Lord Propriety against a certain James Wood of and concerning his Begetting a Bastard Child on the Body of the said Elizabeth.

Whereupon Into Court here in their proper Person<sup>s</sup> comes the said Elizabeth Smalls of Charles County Spinster together with Matthew Cape of same County Planter and Acknowledge themselves to Owe and stand justly Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary In the <sup>full and Just</sup> Sum of Ten pounds Current Money Each which Sum<sup>s</sup> they and each of them severally Gilded and granted should be made and Levied on their & Each of their Goods and Chattells Lands & Tenements to the Use of his said Lordship his Heirs and Successors,
