Whereupon it is ordered that Commission Issue Returnable h[er]e to Wm Penn Robert Gates John Groves and Charles Gates or any three or two of them to Exam the Evidence touching the bounds of the said Tracts or Parcels of Land agreeable to the Directions of the Act of Assembly in those cases left unmade and provided

Anne Towthe P[re]p[ar]es to the Court here the following Petition Viz.

To the Worshippull the Justices of Charle County the Petition of Ann Cooke Humbley Sheweth — That Sarah May (as shall be shewnd of your Petitioners) was Presented about two years agoe for having a baseborn Child. Since where your Petitioners hath entitell to have her adjudged for the Troubling the house; your Petitioners therefore beseech it may be done so also of the Justices of Court that may lay the Child may be bound to her, and your Petitioner shall pay

Upon Readings of which Petition it was ordered by the further M[ea]sures said Court pay Ann Cooke misfortune Two years of Ryer and Troubling the house

Be it Remembred that on this day to wit the second Tuesday in June anno 1727 Ann Coffey unto her in her proper person comes according to the Tenor of a certaine Recognitive taken in Court on the second Tuesday in March last that is to say herselfe in the sum of Ten pounds Current Money of Maryland together with Richard Coffey her man per hour in the like sum for her the said Ann Coffey's appearance to answer of and concerning bearing a bastard Child. Whereupon Henry Darnall Esq; Lord Proprietary Attorney General the same Informand gives the Court to understand that this said Ann was and is guilty of bearing a bastard Child and prays the advice of the Court thereon. Thereupon the said Ann Coffey present her in Court as aforesaid being asked whether she be guilty of the Promises above mentioned answers saith that she is thereof guilty In manner and form as against her it is alledged. Therefore it is considered that the said Ann before Sir Hanmer Compt of Sessions or Thirty Shillings Current money for her offence aforesaid by this Court here adjudged according to the preform and effect of the Assembly in such Cases made and provided and that the said Ann be liable of £ 100.

Whereupon to Court here in his proper Person comes Francis Adams of Charle County Planter and becomes pledge and security for the said Ann to pay the same aforesaid also the several fees incurred to the officers of ministers of the Court here by occasion of the Promises
