She is thereto guilty in manner and form as by the Presentments above against her it is alleged.

And afterwards to wit the same summe of money in fine aforesaid to returne to the court here that he hath done lack of the said judgment upon the said Jane — Whereupon into Court here in his Proper Person came Thomas William Bryan of Charles County Esq; holder and trueame Pledge and security for the aforesaid Jane to pay the several fees due to the officers and ministers of the court here by reason of the premises Inconsideration whereof and the trouble of his service aforesaid — It is adjudged by the court here that that the said Jane do serve her said Master William Bryan One year & half after the expiration of her time of service now due —
