Charles County p. I. Bell Yorke doth declare that on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of May 1719 Robert Horner of this County Gentleman personally appeared before me and acknowledged himself to owe and stand Justly indebted unto his Lordship the Right Honourable the Sum of Forty Pounds Current Money of Maryland (no security for Negro Tom, a slave the Property of Mary Briscoe of said County) and also at same time, the same Robert Horner before me acknowledged himself to owe and stand Justly indebted unto his said Lordship the sum of Ten pounds Current Money aforesaid for Security for Negro Billy a slave the Property of the same Mary Briscoe, which sum he respectively paid and granted should be made and Lived on his Body, Goods, and Chattels, Laid and Agreements for the use of his said Lordship his Heirs and Successors.

The Condition of this Recd: is such, that if the above named Negro Tom shall personally appear before his Lordship, Justice of the Peace at a Court to be holden at Charles Town the second Tuesday in June Next in the County aforesaid, then, and there to Answer unto all such Matters and things as shall be Objected against him in behalf of his Lordship, and not depart the Court without leave thereof and in the mean time to keep the Peace and be on good Behaviour, as also if the above named Negro Billy shall personally before the same Justices, at a sometime and place, and give such Evidence as he shall know against the said Negro Tom in behalf of his Lordship, & not depart the Court without leave thereof, then this Recognizance to be void, else respectively to be and remain in full force Power and Virtue in Law.

I have and Acknowledged before me one of his Lordships Justices of the Peace for the County aforesaid this day and year aforesaid.

And whereas Negro Tom into Court here in his Proper Person comes, and another Material being adduced against him, he the said Negro Tom together with Robert Horner his main Partner from the force and Effect of the same Recognizance are required and directed to pay the County p[er]s fees.
