

# June Court Anno Domini 1719.

Charles County ss. The subscribers being appointed and sworn by the Worshippfull M.C.  
Thom as Stone at the instance and request of Walter Hanson the guardian to Robert Hanson  
One of the orphans of the late De<sup>r</sup> Colonel Robert Hanson to view the Lands and Premises  
left by the last Will and Testament of the said Colonel Hanson to his relation Robert Lee hereby  
Certifie to the Worshippfull Justices of Charles County Court that according to the appointment aforesaid  
we met on the said Lands and found theron a Dwelling House containing a Room Twenty  
foot square Below Stairs with a Closets and Inside Brick Chimney the Twenty foot square Room  
wainscoted quite up on that End where the Chimney stands the other Part leare High wether  
Plaide with further Edge Plank and Covred with Shingles a Bellar under neath which is in  
Good Repair Except the Bellar wall one side whereof is Decayed there is also in the abovesaid  
House two Rooms and a Loft and a Brick fire Place above Stairs also in good Repair a Kitchen  
20 foot Long and 10 foot wide with an Inside Brick Chimney very old Decayed and Wrecked  
out of Repair a White House twelve foot square under pond with Brick in tolerable Good  
Repair one Tobacco House forty foot Long and Twenty foot wide one Deth Thirty foot Long  
and Twenty foot wide Both which want New Cover and the roofs of them out of Repair  
a stable Thirty two foot Long and sixteen foot Wide Planked above and Below in  
tolerable Repair a stable white Sixty foot Long and fifteen foot wide the stones three and a half  
foot long and nine inches thick the whole Building wanting a thorough Repair we further Certifie  
that we find upon the Premises an old Dwelling house an old Corn House and other Negroe Quarters  
with a yard and garden said house not worth Repairing they being so much Decayed we also find  
thirteen hundred Thirtieth Eight Lammes of old felling twenty six Bearingapple Trees and Seventy  
One Beach trees and we further Certifie that we think it Reasonable that the guardian aforesaid  
Should be allowed to Cut Down any Timber or other Trees necessary for Buildings Repairs Tobacco  
beds or fire wood but to have no liberty to clear any Land to tend in the making of a Crop or Crops of  
Corn Tobacco or any other thing what ever that we think it also Reasonable that the guardian aforesaid  
Should be allowed even Thousand pounds of Glass for the necessary Repairs of the Mill and other  
Buildings as are above mentioned and that after these Repairs are made that the yearly Value of the  
Lands and Premises before mentioned to be Three thousand five Hundred Pounds of Tobacco exclusive  
of the Rent due to the Lord Proprietary Given under our Hands and seals the twentieth day  
of April Anno Domini 1719. — E

John Hanson jun<sup>r</sup> & John Hanson Jr. Returns to the Court the following Petition Hlder with their  
Report vs. Charles County ss. To the Worshippfull Justices of Charles County the Humble Pet<sup>r</sup>  
of Alexander Smith Hanson of this County Humbly thereth. That whereas Charles Burn of this  
County has by what Authority or under what Pretence is unknown to your said Petitioners has  
laid upon himself and has actually on Two several Places altered and turn'd the ancient and usual  
Road leading from your said Petitioners House and the neighbourhood thereabout to Allen's Creek  
almost constantly made use of a Branch Road Rolling Stones and other occasions of the Land  
Belonging to the said Charles Burn whereas it has formerly Passe<sup>d</sup> into the Land of your Petitioners  
to the great Inconveniency of all such who have occasion to make use of the said Road a more  
Particular manner to your Worships said Petitioner by cutting down and destroying his timber &  
rending some Part of his Land useless and of no advantage, and whereas further it doth plainly  
appear to all those who are acquainted with the said Road that it was as it were before for more  
Convenient for Rolling Tobacco or any other publick occasions than it can be now —
