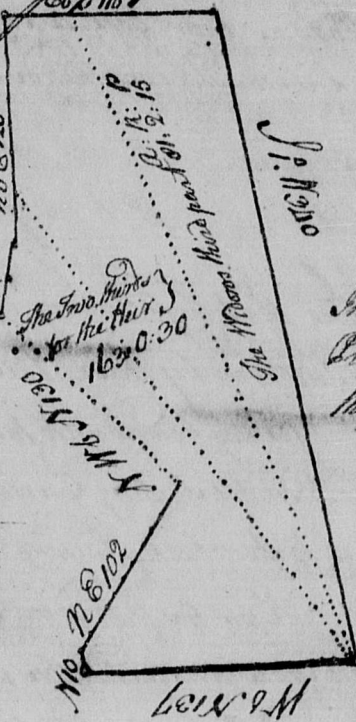
June Court Anno Domini 1759

Ordered by the Court here that the following Instrument of Writing be recorded —
 Charles County, s^r. Know ye that we Barton Warren and Edward Fordquaid County being
 Nominally appointed and sworn to view, and a just Estimate to make of the yearly Value of Two
 Thirds of the Plantation, now in the Possession of Captain Joseph Douglass, and lying in William
 Mary Parish near Lukemason Creek, and belonging to the Heirs of John Harris Deceased, after
 a Division of the said Plantation, and Catherine, Wife of said Joseph, who was the Heir of said
 John Harris, having made her Choice of one Third Part of said Plantation as appear by the Plat
 hereunto annexed, and also the said Joseph and Catherine having signified the same by subscribing their
 Names under the said Plat, We do find on the other Two Thirds of said Plantation, now laid out and
 Appointed for the use and support of the Heir of said John Harris, one Good forty Foot Square House,
 seven Armins of Pannels of old Linn, and Eighty Pannels of Good Linn, and we also the said
 Guardian under whose Care the said Heir is, or hereafter may be, to fell and sell Rail Timber sufficient to
 keep the Premises in Repair and to Clear on the North side of the Main Road what the Guardian shall
 think fitting, and also Timber to keep the Ground Building in like good Repair, and we also do judge the
 Annual Value of said Two Thirds to be five Pounds Current Money, the Main Road above meant in the
 Northmost Road leading down the Neck. In Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands
 and affixed our Seals this 17th day of May 1759.
