Whereupon into Court here in his Proper Person Comes the sa<sup>d</sup> Timothy Mauan of Charles County Taylor and Part<sup>r</sup> Anderson of same County Bricklayer and acknowledge them selves to Owe and Stand lawfully Indebted to the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that is to say the said Timothy in the sum of Forty Pounds Current Money and the said Part<sup>r</sup> Anderson in the sum of Twenty Pounds like Money which sums they and each of them severally Owe and Granted should and might be Levied on their and each of their Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to and for the use of his said Lordship his Heirs and Successors. The Condition of which Recognizance is that if the above bounden Timothy Mauan shall Personally appear at the next County Court to be held on for this County to do & receive what shall be then and there Enjoined him by the said Court and in the mean time that he be of good Behaviour towards his Lordship the Lord Proprietary and all other Officers of this Province and especially towards Andrew Monroe there this Recognizance to be void otherwise to bear and remain in full force and Virtue.

Allen Davies Gentleman Pursuant to an Order of Court holden at Charles Town on the 2<sup>d</sup> Day of November last Returns to the Court here the following Recognizance Viz<sup>d</sup> — Charles County s<sup>t</sup> Memorandum the 18<sup>th</sup> day of November 1749 George Brewell and John Estep of the County afo<sup>r</sup> Gentleman and Elias Smith of the afo<sup>r</sup> County Innholder came before me Allen Davies one of his Lordships Justices of the Peace for the County afo<sup>r</sup> sign and acknowledge themselves to be justly Indebted unto the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of the Province of Maryland Viz<sup>d</sup> the said George Brewell and John Estep separately in the sum of Sixty Shillings Current Money of Maryland and the afo<sup>r</sup> Elias Smith in the sum of Forty Pounds Current Money afo<sup>r</sup> to be Levied on their Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements for the use of the said Lord Proprietary his Heirs and Successors if the afo<sup>r</sup> Elias Smith should make default in the Condition underwritten — The Condition of this Recognizance is such that if the above bounden Elias Smith do keep Good Rules and Orders in his House at Benedict Leonard Town in the County afo<sup>r</sup> according to the Directions of the Act of Assembly of the Province of Maryland Entituled an Act Concerning Ordinaries and for the Better Regulating of Inns Pubs and Ordinary keepers within this Province then the above obligation to paid otherwise to bear and remain in force and Virtue — Allen Davies
