It was Commanded the Coroners of Charles County that they should take the said Johnson late of Charles County Planter of & C. and him safe keep so that they should have his body before the Justices of the Lord Proprietary of his Next County Court to be holden at Charles Town on the second Tuesday in June Next to satisfy unto Samuel Hanson Esq: High Sheriff of the County as well the sum of Twelve Hundred and Twenty five pounds of Tobacco which to the said Samuel in the Court of the said Lord Proprietary before the Justices afo<sup>r</sup> was Adjudged for his Damages which he had by Occasion of a certain Promise and Assumption to the said Samuel at Charles County afo<sup>r</sup> made and Unperformed as also Ten Thousand and one pound of Tobacco which to the same Samuel of his Assent were Adjudged for his Costs and Charges by him about his Suit in this Court in this Court laid out and Expended. Whereof the said Thomas is Convict & C. and that they should have then and there that Writ & C. It was Commanded the Coroners that they should take James Caton late of Charles County Planter of & C. and him safe keep so that they should have his body before the Justices of the Lord Proprietary of his Next County Court to be holden at Charles Town on the second Tuesday in June Next to satisfy unto Sam: Hanson Esq: High Sheriff of Charles County as well the sum of one Thousand and fifty five pounds of Tobacco which to the said Samuel in the Court of the said Lord Proprietary before the Justices afo<sup>r</sup> was Adjudged for his Damages which he had by Occasion of a certain Promise and Assumption to the said Samuel at Charles County afo<sup>r</sup> made and Unperformed as also Ten Thousand Three Hundred Quarters of a pound of Tobacco which to the same Samuel of his Assent were Adjudged for his Costs and Charges by him about his Suit in this Court laid out and Expended whereof the said James Caton is Convict & C. and that they should have then and there that Writ & C. And now here at this day to wit the second Tuesday in June aforesaid Samuel Hanson one of the Coroners afo<sup>r</sup> Returns to the Court here the Writ aforesaid thus Indorsed to wit
