Should aue in Prosecution of the Premises and when the same he had attacted or any Part thereof  
should have it before the Justices of the Lord Proprietary of his said County Court to be held at Charles  
Town on the second Tuesday in June Next then and there to be condemned according to Law to and for the  
use of the said Thomas Coleman unless the said John Dainty should come then and there by himself or  
lawfull Attorney and Answer unto the said Thomas Coleman of a Pleas of Treasons upon the Case and that  
by good and lawfull men of his Burying he should make known to the Person or Persons in whose  
hands he should make the same Attachment that he she or they be and appear before the Justices of the said  
Lord Proprietary at the Place and Time aforesaid to shew cause if any he she or they have why the  
Sum in their or any of their hands attacted should not be condemned according to Law and the said Thomas  
Coleman have therof Execution of 60<sup>o</sup> and how he should execute that will that he should make  
Known to the Justices aforesaid at the Time and Place aforesaid and that he should have therand  
there that will and the names of those before whom he should make the same Known &c<sup>o</sup>  
I Will now heretofore this day to wit the second Tuesday in June aforesaid Comes the said Thomas Coleman  
by Jeremiah Chase his attorney and offers himself against the said John Dainty In the place aforesaid and the  
Sheriff aforesaid Returns to the Court here the Writ aforesaid thus Indorsed viz  
Charles County pr<sup>r</sup> Thereby to the Worshipfull the Justices within mentioned that by Virtue of the Writ  
Will to me directed that on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of April 1729 I Attacted in the hands of Mr. Ramsey for  
the whole Damages and Costs within mentioned and on the same day I Attacted in the hands of  
Richard Estep for the whole Damages and Costs within mentioned to Susanna Ramsey before  
Richard Adams and Thomas McPherson and to Richard Estep before Joseph Johnson and  
Richard Adams, and I have made Known to the above garnishers that they be and appear before  
the Justices within mentioned at the time and Place within prescribed to shew cause why any  
the said Effects should not be condemned according to Law before God and Lawfull men of my  
Burying as I am hereby commanded — *To Answer* *Sam'l Hanson*

And the said Richard Estep into Court here by William Middleton his Attorney comes and  
Confesses that at the time of laying of the Attachment he had and still has of the Effects of the said John  
Dainty to the Value of Forty five Pounds Paper currency and No more / Will be £ 45 0 0 0 the said  
Thomas Coleman by his Attorney aforesaid pray'd remission of the sum of Twenty aforesaid  
in the hands of the said Richard Estep attached with Execution thereof to him to be adjudged  
Therefore it is Considered by the Court here that the said Thomas Coleman have remission  
of the sum of Forty five Pounds Paper currency in the hands of the said Richard Estep and by him  
Confessed as also the sum of Two Hundred and Eighty five Pounds and one half Pound of Tobacco in his  
Costs and Charges by the Court here Adjudged according to the form since and Effect of the Act of  
Assembly in those Cases late made and Provided and that the said Thomas Coleman have the  
Execution of 60<sup>o</sup> — Now Will struck off to Mr. Ramsey —
