

June Court Anno Domini 1729

Should arrive in Prosecution of the Premises and when the same he had attached or any Part that he should have it before the Justices of the Lord Proprietary of his next County Court to be held at Charles Town on the second Tuesday in June Next then and there to be condemned according to Law and for the Use of the said Thomas Coleman unless the said John Dainty should come there and kne by himself or lawfull Attorney and answer unto the said Thomas Coleman of a Plea of Trespass upon the Case and that by good and lawfull men of his Bailiwick he should make known to the Person or Persons in whose hands he should make the same Attachment that he sh^d or they be and appear before the Justices of the said Lord Proprietary at the Place and Time aforesaid to shew Cause if any he sh^d or they have why the Sum in their or any of their hands attached should not be condemned according to Law and the said Thomas Coleman have thereof Execution if he sh^d and how he should Execute that Writ that he should make known to the Justices aforesaid at the Time and Place afo^r and that he should have there and shew that Writ and the Names of those before whom he should make the same known &c.

And now here at this day to wit the second Tuesday in June aforesaid Comes the said Thomas Coleman by Jeremiah Chase his Attorney and offers himself against the said John Dainty in the Plea aforesaid and the Sheriff aforesaid returns to the Court here the Writ aforesaid thus indorsed Viz

Charles County fo^r Shereby to the Worshipfull the Justices within mentioned that by Virtue of the Writ to me directed that on the 22 day of April 1729 I Attached in the hands of Mrs. Ramsey for the whole Damages and Costs within mentioned and on the same day I Attached in the hands of Richard Estep for the whole Damages and Costs within mentioned to Susanna Ramsey before Richard Adams and Thomas M^rPherson and to Richard Estep before Joseph Johnson and Richard Adams, and I have made known to the above named that they be and appear before the Justices within mentioned, at the time and Place within Prescribed to shew Cause why any the said Effects should not be condemned according to Law before God and Lawfull men of my Bailiwick as I am hereby commanded — Joⁿ Answers Sam^l Hanson

And the said Richard Estep into Court here by William Middleton his Attorney Comes and Confesses that at the time of laying the Attachment he had and still has of the Effects of the said John Dainty to the Value of Forty five Pounds Paper Currency and No more Whatsoever the said Thomas Coleman by his Attorney aforesaid Prays Condemnation of the Sum of Money afo^r as afo^r in the hands of the said Richard Estep Attached with Execution thereof to him to be Adjudged. Therefore it is Considered by the Court here that the said Thomas Coleman have Condemnation of the Sum of Forty five Pounds Paper Currency in the hands of the said Richard Estep and by him Confessed as also the Sum of two Hundred and Eighty five Pounds and one half Pound of Tobacco for his Costs and Charges by the Court here Adjudged according to the form force and Effect of the Act of Assembly in those Cases late made and Provided and that the said Thomas Coleman have they Execution of &c. — Mem^o All^d struck off to Sup^r Ramsey
