And Whereupon the same Bennett Administratrix &c. by Jeremiah Chase her Attorney Confesses for that whereas the said William on the Ninth day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and forty Seven at Charles County afo. was indebted unto the said James in his Lifetime in the Sum of Three Pounds Seven Shillings and Ten Pence Currency for divers Particulars lying properly in an Account as by the Particular Account thereof here with unto Court brought may appear and the said William being so thereof indebted In Consideration thereof afterwards to wit the same Ninth day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and forty Seven at the County afo. presented upon himself Affirmed and to the said James Freeman in his Lifetime then and there faithfully Promised that he the said William the said Sum of Three Pounds Seven Shillings and Ten Pence Currency to the said James in his Lifetime would well and truly Content and Pay when the said James should be requested. NEVERTHELESS the said William Smallwood Senior his Promise and Assumption afo. inform afo. made not in the least. Regarding but minding and fraudulently Intending him the said James Freeman In Part Craftily and Subtily to deceive and defraud the said Sum of Three Pounds Seven Shillings and Ten Pence Currency, to him the said James Freeman in his Lifetime or to the said Bennett Dom. afo. after the Death of the said James Freeman to who Administratrix of said Singular the Goods and Chattles Rights and Credits which were of the said James Freeman at the Time of his Death by Walter Hanson Gen. Deputy Commissary of the County afo. after the death of the said James Freeman in due form of Law was committed to the said Bennett at the said William Smallwood Sen. on the Eleventh day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and forty Seven and often afterwards at Charles County afo. afo. by the said James Freeman.
