Therefore it is ordered by the Court here that the said Thomas do recover against the said Daniel his Damages of Eight Hundred and Sixty pounds of Tobacco above acknowledged as also One Hundred and Sixty four pounds and One Quarter of a pound of Tobacco for his Costs and Charges by him about his suit in this Court laid out and Expended Def. in this on his behalf by the Court here adjudged and the said Daniel do thereon in May 1729

James Dixon Judgment According to Ver.

Charles County sh. James Dixon late of Charles County Planter otherwise called James Dixon of Charles County Planter was summoned to answer unto Thomas Turnbull Esq. of a plea that he owes unto them the sum of five thousand four hundred and thirty eight pounds of Tobacco which to them he owes and unpaid by detains and so forth. And Whereupon the same Tho: & Company by Jeremiah Chase their Attorney say that whereas the said James the thirteenth day of Aug^r in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty eight at Charles County sh. by his certain Bill obligatory with the seal of him the said James sealed and hereon Court brought whose date is the day and year afo^r. Acknowledged himself to owe to the said Thomas & Company the sum of two thousand seven hundred and nineteen pounds of good Merchantable Tobacco, or in before the first day of Sept^r Next ensuing the date of the said Writing obligatory and the same Payment well and truly to be made the said James Dixon bound himself his Heirs Ex^{rs} and Administrators in the said Sum of five thousand four hundred and thirty eight pounds of Tobacco for the Payment of the said two thousand seven hundred and nineteen pounds of good Merchantable Tobacco firmly by the said Bill and the said Thomas & Company in fact say that the said James hath not paid to them the said Thomas & Company the said Sum of two thousand seven hundred and nineteen pounds of Tobacco as afo^r or any part thereof upon the afo^r first day of September which to them on the afo^r day he ought to have paid according to the form and Effect of the Bill afo^r. by which Action hath accrued to the said Thomas & Company Demand of the said James Dixon the said Sum of five thousand four hundred and thirty eight lbs of Tobacco nevertheless the said James as this often required hath not paid to the said Thomas & Company the said Sum of five thousand four hundred and thirty eight pounds of Tobacco nor any part thereof but hitherto altogether hath and still doth refuse to pay the same wherefore they say they are the worse and have Damage to the Value of Ten thousand pounds of Tobacco and there fore suit is brought for the said
