Mary Roby Prerer to the Court here the following Petition Viz
 To the Worshipful the Justices of Charles County in Court now sitting the Petition of Mary Roby in humble manner sheweth that whereas your Petitioner being seized of a Tract of Land known by the Name of Kitchelers Adventure lying in Charles County which said Land may probably be Lost in a small time by the death of some persons who is able to Prove the bounds thereof she hopes your Worships will grant a Commission out of Court in order to Cause take the bounds of the said Land and your Petitioner as in duty bound will ever pay. Mary Roby.
 Whereupon it is ordered that Commission Issue Returnable here to Thomas Stone Samuel Hawkins Richard Stone and Gerrard Forke Gentlemen or any Two or Three of them to Examine Evidences touching the bounds of the said Tract of Land.

 To the Justices of Charles County now sitting in Court. The Humble Petition of Ignatius Sympson and William Sympson of said County sheweth that whereas your Petitioners being become Executors for John Wathen and Hudson of said County Executors of the last Will and Testament of John Wathen Deceased to be the Childrens part of the Estate for the Coming and being informed that the said Executors do not take such care of the same as becometh whereby your Petitioners is likely to be great Sufferers, unless Relieved by this Worshipful Court. Your Petitioners therefore humbly prays your Worships will be pleased to Order the said John Wathen, and Hudson Wathen to give Jurities and to make such further Orders as to your Worships shall seem meet. And your Petitioners as in duty bound shall ever Pray. Whereupon it is ordered that Summons Issue to the said Wathen and John Wathen to Answer the Petition of the afo. Ign and William Sympsons. Returnable to November Court Next.

Ordered by the Justices of the Court here that Timothy Maccan Recognise in the sum of one Hundred Pounds Current Money with sufficient Security in the sum of one Hundred Pound Like Money for his good Behaviour to and appearance before his Lordships Justices of a sive His Pruis Oyer, Terminer and Goal Delivery to be held at Charles Town the Twenty fifth day of September then Next to answer &c. Whereupon into Court here in his proper Person comes the afo. Timothy Maccan of Charles County Taylor and John Hamie and Thomas Bailey of same County Planters and acknowledge themselves to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that is to say the said afo. Maccan in the sum of one Hundred Pounds Current Money and the afo. John Hamie and the afo. Bailey in the sum of Fifty Pounds Like Money each, which Sums they and each of them severally yielded and Granted should and might be levied on their and each of their Goods and Chattels Lands and Invements to and for the Use of his Lordship his Heirs Successors
