Aug<sup>r</sup> 1729 the said Richard Tubman in Custody of the Sheriff namely Samuel Hanson Gentleman to the  
Court here brought in his proper Person and being demanded of him by the Court here whether  
he be Guilty of the Breach of the Peace afo<sup>r</sup> so on him imposed by the said Richard Tubman that he is  
in no wise sense of Guilty but that he will not contend with his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in  
this Court Humbly submits himself to the Court — Therefore it is considered that the said Rich<sup>d</sup>  
Tubman before the sum of Twenty Shillings Current Money for the offence afo<sup>r</sup> by the Court here  
adjudged and that the said Richard Tubman betaken to — Whence presents Court here on his proper  
Person Comes John Hamill of Charles County Clerk and business Pledge and Security for the said Rich<sup>d</sup>  
Tubman to pay the fine afo<sup>r</sup> and also the usual fees &c. due to the Officers and Ministers of the Court here  
by occasion of the Premises.
