And Whereas upon the said Inventory by Amiah Chase her attorney Complaints for that
 whereas the said Henry on the Twenty Sixth day of August in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven
 Hundred and Sixty Seven at Charles County aforesaid was indebted unto the said James Freeman in his
 Lifetime in the sum of Fifteen Pounds Eleven Shillings and Eleven pence halfpenny Currency for divers
 Particulars lying Properly in an amount as by the Particulars account thereof herewith into Court brought may
 appear and the said Henry being so thereof Indebted in Consideration whereof afterwards to wit the same
 Twenty Sixth day of August in the year and at the County aforesaid upon himself assumed and to the same
 James Freeman in his Lifetime then and there faithfully promised that he the said Henry Marten
 the said sum of Fifteen Pounds Eleven Shillings and Eleven pence halfpenny Currency to the said
 James Freeman in his lifetime would well and truly Content and pay when thereunto afterwards he should
 be required. nevertheless the said Henry Marten his Prime and Assumption aforesaid informed made
 notice the least regarding but minded and fraudulent by Intending him the said James Freeman in
 this part craftily and Subtily to accuse and defraud the said sum of Fifteen Pounds Eleven Shillings
 and Eleven pence halfpenny Currency to him the said James in his Lifetime or to the said James Freeman
 Administratrix aforesaid after the death of the said James to whom Administration of all and Singular the
