Sworn Eight at Charles County aforesaid by his certain Bill Obligatory with the hel  
of him the said Thomas Sanders sealed and here in Court brought whose date is the day and year  
aforesaid acknowledged himself his Heirs Exors &c. to owe to Watter Scott or Messrs Reid and  
Company or Mr David Ross or the Order of either their Heirs &c. the sum of three Thousand &  
thirty Nine pounds Good Clean Sound Tobacco of Cask in three Parts to be paid on or before  
the first day of April Next to come after the date of the said Writing Obligatory and the same Payment  
will and truly to be made and done the said Thomas Sanders Bound himself his Heirs Exors &c.  
In the aforesaid Sum of six Thousand pounds Tobacco so as aforesaid firmly by the said Bill and the said  
David Ross in fact saith that the said Thomas Sanders hath not paid to the said David Ross or to  
the said Watter Scott or to the said Messrs Reid and Company or either of them the aforesaid Sum of  
three Thousand and thirty Nine pounds Tobacco so as aforesaid nor any part thereof upon the aforesaid first  
day of April which to them on the said day he ought to have paid according to the form and effect of the  
Bill aforesaid by which Action hath accrued to the said David Ross to have and demand of the  
Thomas Sanders the said Sum of six Thousand pounds Tobacco Nevertheless the  
Thomas Sanders altho often requested hath not paid to the said David Ross nor to the said Watter Scott  
nor to the said Messrs Reid and Company or either of them the said Sum of six Thousand pounds  
Tobacco or any part thereof but hath and still doth altogether Refuse to pay the same  
Wherefore he saith he is the Worse and hath damage to the Value of Ten Thousand Pounds like  
Tobacco and therefore Suit is brought and so forth Pld. 1/2c. <sup>John Doe</sup> <sub>Ruth. Roe</sub>

And the said Thomas Sanders in his proper person comes and defends the force and Injury  
when &c. and saith that he cannot deny the Action &c. of him the said David Ross nor but that  
he owes to the said David the said Sum of six Thousand pounds Good Clean Sound Tobacco in manner  
and form as the said David above against him complains. Therefore it is considered by the  
Court here that the said David do recover against the said Thomas his debt &c. and his damages by  
Occasion of detaining that debt to Ten Thousand and thirty six pounds of Tobacco to the same  
Defendant David Ross on his Assent by the Court here Adjudged and the said Thomas Sanders in Money &c.

Answer unto Samuel Hodgson of a plea of Trespass upon the Case and so forth  
And Whereupon the same Samuel by William Whiteleton his Attorney complains  
that whereas the said Edward the Twenty eighth day of April in the year of our Lord one Thousand  
Seven Hundred and forty Eight at Charles County aforesaid was indebted to the said Sam. Hodgson  
In the sum of three pounds Seven Shillings and Seven pence half penny Currency for divers Articles  
lying properly in an Account as by the Particular Account thereof herewith into Court bro't  
may appear and being so thereof Indebted the aforesaid Edward in consideration thereof afterwards to  
wit the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid upon himself Assumed and to the said Samuel  
then and there faithfully Promised that he the said Edward the said Sum of three pounds Seven  
Shillings and Seven pence half penny Currency to the said Samuel when thereunto aforesaid  
he should be requested Nevertheless the said Edward his Promise &c. Assumption
