Robert Fillingham & Co. Condemnation for s. q. q. d. & s. q. Tobacco

WHEREAS Joseph Lile lately in our Court of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that is to say his County Court held at Charles Town on the second Tuesday in June last before Guis. Brown Gentleman and his associates justices in the County aforesaid all previous Requisites on part of the said Joseph Lile being performed obtained Judgment for his said Lordships that of Attachment to issue against the goods Chattels & Credits of a certain Robert Fillingham & Co. for as well the sum of four pounds Nine Shillings and Ninepence Sterling certain Damages as for what had accrued and that should hereafter accrue in and about the Premises.

It was Commanded the Sheriff that of the goods Chattels and Credits of the said Robert Fillingham & Co. in his Bailiwick being the said attachment as well the damages as well as one thousand pounds of Tobacco for Costs as aforesaid and when the same or any part thereof he had Attached that he should have it before the justices of the said Lord Proprietary of his next County Court to be held at Charles Town aforesaid on the second Tuesday in August next then & there to be condemned according to Law to and for the use of the said Joseph Lile unless the said Robert & Company should come then and there by themselves or Lawfull Attorney and Answer unto the said Joseph Lile a plea of Trespass upon the Case and that by Good and Lawfull men of his Bailiwick he should make known to the person or persons in whose hands he made the same Attachment that he she or they be and appear before the Justices aforesaid at the day and place aforesaid to shew Cause if any he she or they have why the sums in their or any of their hands Attached should not be Condemned and the said Joseph Lile have thereof Execution if &c. and how he should execute that Writ that he should make known unto the justices aforesaid at the day and place aforesaid that he should have then and there that Writ and the Names of those before whom he should make the same known &c.

And now here at this day to wit the second Tuesday in August aforesaid Comes the said Joseph Lile by Serjeant Chase his Attorney and offers himself against the said Robert & Co. in the plea aforesaid and the Sheriff aforesaid Returns to the Court here the Writ aforesaid indorsed by Charles County aforesaid. I hereby Certify to the Writs full the justices within mentioned that by virtue of the within Writ to me directed on the 29th day of July 1759 I Attached in the hands of Edward Diggs on 5th day of August for the whole Damages and Costs within mentioned, and also in the hands of Mary Neale Widow of Raphael for the whole Damages and Costs within mentioned & also I have made known to the above Garnishers that they be and appear before the Justices within mentioned at the time and place within prescribed to shew Cause why the Effects of Robert Fillingham & Company should not be Condemned for the use of Joseph Lile according to Law, before James Neale & William Hungerford Two Good and Lawfull men of my Bailiwick.

And the said Mary Neale Widow of Raphael the sum of four pounds Nine Shillings and Ninepence Sterling at this solemnly called Comes not but makes default. Whereupon the said Joseph Lile by his Attorney aforesaid prays Condemnation of the sum of Money aforesaid in the hands of the Garnisher aforesaid Attached with Execution thereof to him to be adjudged. Therefore it is Considered by the Court that the said Joseph Lile have Condemnation of the sum of money aforesaid as also the sum of (Three)
