Whereupon into Court here in his proper Person Comes the said James Mudd and Acknowledges himself to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the Sum of Forty Pounds Current Money of Maryland and also in like manner Came Mr. Morris and Henry Marten of Charles County Planters and Acknowledges themselves to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his said Lordship in the Sum of Twenty Pounds like Money Each which Sums they and Every of them severally Yielded and Granted should be made and Levied on their and Every of their Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the Use of his said Lordship his Heirs and Successors. On Condition that the said James Mudd do keep Good Rules and Orders and does not suffer Idle Loose or Disorderly Persons to Tattle Game or Commit other Disorders or Irregularities Contrary to the True Intent and meaning of the Act of Assembly Concerning Ordinaries and for the Better Regulating Innholders and ordinary Keepers within this Province
