 manner Came George Thomas and Edward Sausot of same County Planters and Acknow ledge  
 themselves to Owe and Stand Justly Indebted unto his said Lordship In the Sum of Twenty  
 Pounds like Money Cash which Sums they and Every of them severally yielded and Granted  
 should be made and Levied on their and Every of their Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements  
 to the Use of his said Lordship his Heirs and Successors. On Condition that the said William  
 Brown do keep good Rules and Orders and does not suffer Idle Loose or Disorderly Persons to  
 Tittle Game or Commit other disorders or Irregularities Contrary to the True Intent and meaning  
 of the Act of Assembly Concerning Ordinaries and for the better Regulating Inholders Ordinary  
 Keepers within this Province

 Sums they and Each of them severally yielded and Granted should be made and Levied on their &  
 Every of their Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the Use of his said Lordship his  
 Heirs and Successors On Condition that the said Charles Jones do keep good Rules and  
 Orders and does not suffer Idle Loose or Disorderly Persons to Tittle Game or Commit  
 other disorders or Irregularities Contrary to the True Intent and meaning of the Act of Assembly  
 Concerning Ordinaries and for the better Regulating Inholders Ordinary Keepers within this Province

 Whereupon it was ordered the Sheriff that he should have the body of the said Mary Fowler  
 before the Court here immediately to answer the Premises. And afterwards to wit the same  
 second Tuesday in November afo the said Mary Fowler in Custody of the Sheriff afo. namely  
 Samuel Hanson Esq. to the Court here brought in her proper person Jones, Whereupon it is  
 ordered that the said Mary Fowler for want of Security be committed in to the Custody of the  
 Sheriff afo. then to remain until the next Provincial Court to be held at the City of Annapolis
