Lord Proprietary, Breach of the Peace

Hugh Redman & Convict on Submission

Be it Remembered that on this day to wit the second Tuesday in November A.D. by
the Oath of Fifteen Jurors Namely Samuel Hawkins &c was Presented Hugh Redman
for Breach of his Lordships Peace on the body of Richard Myran.

And afterward doth on the second Tuesday in November A.D. Hugh Redman unto Court here
in his proper person comes and being demanded of him by the Court here Whether he be guilty
of the Breach of the peace aforesaid so on him Imposed he the said Hugh saith that he is in no wise
thereof guilty but for that he will not Comply with his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in this
Part Humbly submits himself to the Court. Therefore it is Considered that the said Hugh
Redman before the sum of One Shilling Current Money for the offence aforesaid by the Court here be judged
and that the said Hugh Redman be taken &c Whereupon into Court here in his proper
Person James Robert Morrison of Charles County and becomes Pledge and Security for the same
Hugh Redman to pay the fine aforesaid and also the several fees arising due to the officers and
Ministers of the Court here by Occasion of the Premises

Ordered by the Justices of the Court here that Negroe Clemen the slave of Mr. John
Wheally committed by Captain Davies on suspicion of Felony, and nothing appearing
against the said Negroe he is Discharged from the custody of the Sheriff

Ordered by the Justices of the Court here that Negroe Gorren the slave of Doctor
Brown committed by Mr. Robert Yates on suspicion of Murder, and nothing appearing
against the said Negroe he is Discharged from the custody of the Sheriff

John Gray Junior makes oath on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God that he destroyed Seventy
One Squirrel heads for which he has had no allowance Whereupon he is allowed One Hundred and Thirteen
Pounds and Three fifths of a pound of tobacco

John Gray Senior makes oath on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God that he destroyed Sixty Two
Squirrel heads for which he has had no allowance Whereupon he is allowed Ninety Nine Pounds One fifth of a pound of Tobacco

James Gray makes oath on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God that he destroyed One Hundred & Eleven Pounds
Heads for which he has had no allowance Whereupon he is allowed One hundred & One pound Pounds Three fifths of a pound of Tobacco
