Beit Remembered that on this day to wit the second Tuesday in November 1749 Winter one of his Lordships the Lord Proprietarys Justices of the peace for the County of Charles County Memorandum that on the third day of September came before me in their proper persons Richard Bennett Boorman and William M'Pherson both of this County and returned ledged themselves to owe and stand justly indebted unto his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary the sum of forty pounds current Money Each which sums they and each of them yielding and granting should be made and Levied on their body's goods and Chattels lands and Tenements for the use of his said Lordship his Heirs and Successors. Upon Condition that if the above bounden Richard Bennett Boorman shall make his Personal appearance before his Lordships Justices of the peace for this County on the second Tuesday of November Next ensuing at a Court to be held at Charles Town then and there to do and abide by the Judgment of the Court and not to depart without leave thereof and in the mean time to keep the peace and be of good behaviour & Especially to ward Jacob Andrew Minister of same County then this Recognizance to be void or Else to remain in full force power and Virtue in Law, taken and Acknowledged before one of his Lordships Justices of the peace for the aforesaid County In Winter
