February 27<sup>th</sup> Benjamin Adams Aged Sixty eight years or there about being sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God Declares that to the best of his Knowledge about thirty years ago being in Company with Thomas Rigg Under a Walnut tree the said Rigg asked this Deponent if he thought that Walnut tree was not in his Line this Deponent told him he did not know, the said Rigg Pointed towards a Round tree which is now standing, and said there stands a Round tree of Charles Adams Land being the same tree first mentioned in Peter Atterburns oath standing near the Path that goes to Watters woman and further saith not


1788 February 27<sup>th</sup> Peter Forhan Aged forty six years or there about being sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God Declares that the White Oak mentioned in Peter Atterburns Deposition both Thomas Rigg and Old John Gardiner has told him it was a Round tree of the same Land called Nonesuch and being carried from the aforementioned Whites Oak to another White Oak Declares that Old John Gardiner showed it to Peter Rigg and this Deponent for a Round tree of the said Land and further saith not


