It is therefore Comman'ded the Sheriff that he Cause to Come here Immediately a Jury of the County and the Jurors aforesaid of the County by the Sheriffs here to be performed being Called Come that is to say John Hanson Junior Francis Dunnington Michael Abery Richard Lambre William M'Pherson Thomas Morris John M'Pherson John Chandler Holland Middleton Thomas Jackson Hatch Denton Matthew Gady who to speak the truth in the Premises being Exhibited tryed & sworn upon their Oaths to say that the said Negro James is not Guilty of the Felony aforesaid in manner & form as by the Indictment aforesaid against him it is supposed. Whereupon the said Negro James and the Subject matter therein contained from the force and Effect of the same Indictment is acquit & Discharged

Well Remember'd that on this day to wit the second Tuesday in November aforesaid Comes here Hugh Redman according to the Tenor of a certain Recognizance taken here on the second Tuesday in March last and Continued respited to this Court for his the said Hugh Redman's appearance here etc. And afterwards to wit the same second Tuesday in November aforesaid John Hammill Surety for the aforesaid Hugh Redman delivers him up to the Court. Whereupon the said John Hammill from the force and Effect of the same Recognizance is acquit & Discharged. Therefore it is Considered by the Court here that the said Hugh Redman Recognize in the sum of Twenty pounds Current Money of Maryland with one Surety in the sum of Ten pounds like Money for his good Behaviour to and appearance here from day to day during the sitting of this Court to answer etc. Whereupon into Court here in his proper person Comes the aforesaid Hugh Redman and Robert Morrison of same County and do knowlege themselves to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that is to say the said Hugh Redman in the sum of Twenty pounds Current Money of Maryland and the said Robert Morrison in the sum of Ten pounds like Money which sums they and each of them severally jointly and jointly should and might be made and levied on their and each of their Body's Goods and Chattels lands and Tenements to and for the use of his said Lordship his Heirs and Successors on Condition that the said Hugh Redman do make his Personal appearance here from day to day during the sitting of this Court to answer and call such matters and things as shall be objected against him on behalf of his Lordship the Lord Proprietary and stand to and abide by the Judgment of the said Court and in the meantime keep the peace and be of good Behaviour towards his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary and all other People of this Province and not depart this same Court without leave thereof And afterwards to wit the same second Tuesday in November aforesaid Hugh Redman into Court here in his proper person Comes according to the Tenor of the Recognizance aforesaid taken here this Court for his the said Hugh Redman's appearance here etc. Whereupon no thing material being Alleged against the said Hugh Redman he and his main the force and Effect of the same Recognizance taken here this Court are acquit and Discharged the Court here in his proper person Comes Robert Morrison of Charles County the same pledge and Surety to pay the several fees aforesaid
