Governour Paper of the Great Seal or Secretary of this Province nor any Court or Justice of the County within the said Daniel Brown Provided and Inhabited Certifying his Freedom as the said Act of Assembly Doeth and the said Joseph Pile in fact saith that the said Daniel Brown the said sum of Four pounds ten Shillings and three pence Paper Currency and one pound nine Shillings and ten pence Gold Currency or any part thereof the said Joseph did not pay or satisfy and that by reason of the said Henry Thompson his transporting and conveying away the said Daniel Brown over Potomack River into the Colony of Virginia a Negro by virtue of the said Act of Assembly the said Henry became bound and is chargeable to pay and chargeable with the Payments of the said sum of four pounds ten Shillings and three pence Paper Currency and one pound nine and ten pence Gold Currency to the said Joseph Pile yet the said Henry although oftentimes the said four pounds ten Shillings and three pence Paper Currency and one pound nine Shillings and ten pence Gold Currency or any part thereof to the said Joseph hath not paid or satisfied but the same to him to pay the said Henry a together hitherto hath refused and still doth refuse to the Damage of the said Joseph Pile Nine pounds and six pence Paper Currency and two pounds seven Shillings and eight pence Gold Currency and therefore he brings Suit and so forth.
