

# November Court Anno Dom: 1719

It was Commanded the Sheriff that he should take William Howard late of Charles County Sheriff otherwise called William Howard of Charles County Sheriff of 16<sup>th</sup> and him safe keep so that he should have his body before the Justices of the Lord Proprietary of his Great County Court to be holden at Charles Town on the second Tuesday in November to satisfy unto Philip Key as well the Sum of thirty two pounds Ten Shillings Current Money a certain Debt which the same Philip Key lately in the Court of the said Lord Proprietary before the Justices of Charles County aforesaid sued against the said William Howard as also Two Hundred thirty seven & three quarters of a pound of 16<sup>th</sup> which to the same Philip Key by Discretion of the Justices aforesaid of his aforesaid were adjudged for his Damages which he had by Occasion of detaining that debt whereof the said W<sup>th</sup> Howard is Convent 16<sup>th</sup> and that he should have then and there that Writ 16<sup>th</sup> And now hereat this day to wit the second Tuesday in November aforesaid the Sheriff Returns to the Court here the Writ aforesaid thus Indorsed Viz

Charles County fo: It was Commanded the Sheriff (whereas James Neale who as well for the Lord Proprietary as for himself lately in the Court of the Lord Proprietary that is to say his County Court holden at Leonard Town in and for the County of Saint Marys the first Tuesday of June in the thirty third year of the Dominion of the Lord Proprietary before Thomas Asquith Gentleman and his Associates Justices of the said County Court had recovered against Mary Chamberlain late of Saint Marys County Spinster as well the Sum of two Thousand pounds of Tobacco a certain Debt as also Four Hundred & forty two pounds of Tobacco which to the same James who as well 16<sup>th</sup> of his aforesaid by Discretion of the Justices of the said County of S<sup>th</sup> Marys were adjudged for his Damages which he had by Occasion of detaining that debt and whereas also the aforesaid James who as well 16<sup>th</sup> pursuant to the directions of the Act of Assembly in those Cases made and provided lately before the Justices of his said Lordships Court that is to say his County Court holden at Charles Town in and for the same County of Charles on the second in June last before Quatuor Baron Gentleman and his Associates Justices of his said Lordships Charles County Court produced a Transcript of the Records of the Recovery aforesaid under the Seal of the Court of Saint Marys County attested by the Clerk of the same County Court and thereon by Consideration of his said Lordships Justices of Charles County Court had judgment that Execution should issue against the said Mary for as well the debt aforesaid in the Recovery aforesaid mentioned as the Sum of two Hundred and twenty three pounds of Tobacco which to the same James Neale who as well 16<sup>th</sup> at his Request by discretion of the Justices last aforesaid were adjudged for his additional Costs whereof the said Mary is Convent) that he should take the aforesaid Mary of the shall be found in her Bail which she should have her body before the Justices of the Lord Proprietary his Great County Court to be holden at Charles Town on the second Tuesday in November next to satisfy unto the said James who as well 16<sup>th</sup> as well the debt Damages aforesaid in the Recovery aforesaid mentioned as the additional Damages aforesaid by his said Lord's Justices last mentioned adjudged 16<sup>th</sup> and that he should have then and there that Writ 16<sup>th</sup> Which day to wit the second Tuesday in November aforesaid the Sheriff aforesaid Returns to the Court here the Writ aforesaid thus Indorsed Viz

Whereupon into Court here in her proper person comes <sup>the s<sup>th</sup></sup> Mary Chamberlain and Confesses her self to be the same person taken in Execution. On which at the prayer of the said James Neale who as well 16<sup>th</sup> the said Mary Chamberlain is committed into the Custody of the Sheriff namely Samuel Hanson Gentleman by Occasion of the premises shall remain until 16<sup>th</sup>
