 unto Thomas Hungerford of a plea of trespass upon the said and a forth

And the said Thomas Hungerford by Jeremiah Chase his Attorney complains that he has
 the said Patrick Mackatee the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred &
 forty eight at Charles County ap. was indebted to the said Thomas Hungerford in the sum of Nine
 Hundred & twenty five pounds of Tobacco and a half pound of Tobacco for divers articles lying properly
 in an account as by the Particular account thereof here with in to Court brought may appear and
 being so thereof indebted the said Patrick Mackatee in Consideration thereof afterwards to wit the
 Day and day at the County ap. upon himself assumed and to the said and to the said the
 Hungerford the said and here faithfully promised that he the said Patrick Mackatee should pay of Nine
 Hundred and twenty five pounds of Tobacco and a half pound of Tobacco to the said Thomas
 when thereunto afterwards he should be requested and he duly would Content and pay
 Nevertheless the said Patrick Mackatee his Promise and Assumption ap. in form
 as aforesaid made not in the least regarding but minding and fraudulently forswearing the said
 Thomas in this Part Craftily and subtilly to deceive and defraud the said Patrick Mackatee the said
 sum of Nine Hundred and twenty five pounds of Tobacco and a half pound of Tobacco or any
 Part thereof to the said Thomas hath not paid or in any sort Contented altho. it is so the said
 Patrick was on the 15th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred &
 forty nine and often to be seen and viewed at Charles County ap. by the said Thomas requested
 but the said Patrick the said sum of Nine Hundred & twenty five pounds of Tobacco and a half pound of Tobacco
 in any sort to Content hath hitherto altogether Refused and still doth Refuse to the Damage of the said
 Thomas Hungerford Nineteen Hundred & fifty One pounds of Tobacco and therefore suit is brought to forth
