On the 22<sup>nd</sup> Day of February 1759 Came William Shipin before me one of his Lordships Justices of the Peace and made oath on the Holy Evangelist that the above act is just and true and that he hath not received any factor Vence therefor any Vengeance or Satisfaction for the same more than what is given to the Master of his Knowledge.

Sworn before His Honor

Whereupon into Court herein his Payer Person Came Henry Thompson of Charles County Planter and becomes Pledge and Security for the said Thomas that if it should happen the said Thomas in the Plea should be convicted that then the said Henry yield and grant that the said Damages of 8<sup>l</sup>. as all Costs which the said Daniel & Company in this part should be adjudged of his Land and Chattels should be made and paid to and for the Use of the said Daniel & Company if it should happen the said Thomas the Damages and Costs of 8<sup>l</sup>. to the said Daniel and Company should not pay for his Body into the Custody of the Sheriff by Reason thereof. And the said Thomas Thompson Junior by Thomas Clark his Attorney Comes and Defends the Plea and Injures when the said Plea is since then to be made here until the Next Court to be holden at Charles Town on the Second Tuesday in June Next and he hath it and the same day is given to the said Daniel & Company here. At which day to wit the Second Tuesday in June 1759 Comes and Defends the said Daniel & Company by their Attorney as the said Thomas by his Attorney as. and the said Thomas by his said Attorney Prays further since then to be made here until the Next Court to be holden at Charles Town on the Second Tuesday in August Next and he hath it and the same day is given to the said Daniel & Company here. At which day to wit the Second Tuesday in August 1759 Comes and Defends the said Daniel & Company by their Attorney as. as the said Thomas by his Attorney as. and the said Thomas by his said Attorney Prays further since then to be made here until the Next Court to be holden at Charles Town on the Second Tuesday in November Next and he hath it and the same day is given to the said Daniel & Company here. At which day to wit the Second Tuesday in November 1759 Comes and Defends the said Daniel & Company by their Attorney as. as the said Thomas by his Attorney as. and the said Thomas by his said Attorney Prays further since then to be made here until the Next Court to be holden at Charles Town on the Second Tuesday in March Next and he hath it and the same day is given to the said Daniel & Company here. And now to wit this day to wit the Second Tuesday in March 1759 Comes and Defends the said Daniel & Company by their Attorney as. as the said Thomas by his Attorney as. and the said Thomas by his said Attorney Comes and Defends the Plea and Injures when the said Thomas says that he is not Gilty the Action of the said Daniel & Company nor but that he did assault upon him self in Manner and form as the said Daniel & Company in their Declaration above against them have Complaind nor also but that the said Daniel & Company hath sustained nor also but that the said Daniel & Company hath sustained Damages by means of not expensing the Premises and assumptions of 8<sup>l</sup>. to Eighteen Shillings and twenty pence and one half pound of Tobacco as the said Daniel & Company above in Declaring supposes. Whereupon the said Daniel & Company by Jeremiah Chase his Attorney as. prays Judgment and those Damages so acknowledged together with his Costs and Charges by him about his Suit in this part Paid out and Expended to them to be adjudged. Therefore it is considered by the Court there that the said Daniel & Company do Recover against the said Thompson their Damages of 8<sup>l</sup>. to Eighteen Shillings and twenty pence and one half pound of Tobacco above acknowledged as also the sum of Two Shillings and Twenty four pence of Tobacco for his Costs and Charges by him about his Suit in this part and his out and Expended as affirmed on his Oath by the Court here adjudged and the said Thompson Junior in Mercy to
