late of Charles County Planter being you value to be made as well the sum of Fifty  
six pounds four Shillings and ten pence Currency and Four Thousand pounds of Tob:  
Certain Damages which Samuel Suchott recovered against the said Edward  
Sanders in the Court of the Lord Proprietary as also four Hundred and thirty pounds  
of Tobacco for his cost and Charges which he had by occasion of Detaining his Dem:  
as afo. and the same Edward Sanders before the Justices of the said Lord Proprietary  
of his Next Court to be holden at Charles Town on the second Tuesday in March  
Next to render unto the said Samuel his Damages & Costs afo. and have you  
then and there that Writtafo. And now here at this day to wit the second Tuesday  
In March afo. the Sheriff afo. returned to the Court here the Writtafo. have Endorsed Viz:  
Charles County fo. To the Sheriff full the Justices within mentioned hereby certify that by virtue  
of the within Writtafo. directed on the 31. day of Jan<sup>y</sup> 1749 I & the Justices the same be appear by  
a Schedule of appraisement of goods & chattels
