The election news from New Hampshire is of the most gratifying character. The Governor of the Union party has been elected with a majority of over four thousand. And the whole State has rebuked the Copperheads and shown their intention to crush the rebellion

It is gratifying to see the overwhelming majority with which the City of New York has carried the vote in favor of conceding to soldiers of her State the right to exercise the election franchise. Nine thousand five kundred majority, out of a vote of 23,000. Well done New York! The world moves.

20 Col. ULRIC DAHLGREN who accompanied Gen. KILPATRICK in his raid around the outposts of Richmond, was the son of Admiral Dawleren, commanding the fleet off Charleston. Although so young, yet none since the war commenced, have displayed greater bravery .-The less of a limb could not deter him from active service. The whole loyal portion of the country mourns his untimely death.

We understand that Acting Assistant Surgeon M. STOVELL, has been relieved from duty at this Hospital and ordered to Fort Delaware. Dr. STOVELL, has been for nearly if not quite, two years in the discharge of professional duties at Annapolis. While his many friends will regret his departure, yet he will be followed with many kind wishes for his success and comfort at his new and important post.

Rumors are afloat of an apprehended interruption of the peaceful relations existing between this country and France. We have had so many of these since the war began, assuring us that the Southern Confederacy was about to be recognized, that we regard them all as false alarms. We shall wait until we have some official intelligence on this point, and not be disturbed by the statements of those who only have the rise and fall of gold or stocks in their mind.

It is with much sorrow we record the sudden death of the wife of the Rev. Mr. Bent, Chaplain under the auspices of the Christian Commission at Camp Parole. She died on last Saturday morning, after an illness of three days. Her kindness and attention to the soldiers at this camp will make her memory long remembered and cherished. In the Chapel services and at the Bible class, she was always seen, evincing the deep interest which she felt in the moral and religious welfare of those enlisted in the cause of our country.

On Wednesday last over six hundred men were received at this post by flag of truce boat New York, from Richmond. Nearly fifty officers also arrived. Over one hundred and seventy were admitted into this Hospital. Not many compared with those received in the early part of the winter, are serious cases. Indeed all agreeably surprise us in their appearance. But from representations made by the present number, we fear that hundreds remain on Belle Isle, in the lowest depths of suffering and want. We are cheered with the hope that many more boat loads will soon arrive.

The Concert given in the Chapel, at Division Hospital No. 1, on last Monday evening, was one that gave entire satisfaction, and elicited the praise of all present. The singers both ladies and gentlemen showed that they were well qualified as an association, to act their part at a musical entertainment. The absence of the pianist was supplied by Mr. EDWARD KELSEY, an inmate of the Hospital. The skill with which he played the accompaniment to the several pieces gave entire satisfaction; and all felt greatly indebted for this voluntary service. The proceeds of the concert fully met expectation. Two hundred dollars and thirteen cents were realized clear of all expenses. Measures have been taken to get the band. The funds obtained are, not quite sufficient, yet we hope the additional amount will be soon secured.
