Many troops are arriving at this post composing the Burnside expedition. On Tuesday two regiments arrived—the 3d New Jersey Cavalry and the 8th U. S. Artillery. We are sorry to announce that many from these regiments are in the Hospitals sick.

The Sanitary and Christian Commissions have both, agents laboring for the welfare and comfort of the soldiers in the several camps and Hospitals at Annapolis. The Sanitary Commission has a tent with a large supply of stores for the relief of the suffering among the recently arrived regiments.

The appearance of our Chapel will be much improved if we may judge from the cleansing process going on there. The seats have been all nicely painted and varnished, and we understand a very beautiful chandelier has been procured by Chaplain HENRIES through the liberality of friends in Philadelphia.

We wish to state to those of our subscribers who commenced with the first number of the Church, paying for three months, that the time expired with the issue of last week's paper. We hope all will come forward and renew their subscriptions. We cannot continue them without complying with this condition.

An interview is said to have taken place between General Butler, and Commissioner OULB, resulting in an arrangement for an exchange of prisoners. The terms of exchange have not been made public. But in General BUTLER's hands it will not be such as to compromise the dignity or authority of our Government. We sincerely hope it may be true, that we are soon to welcome all our men who have so long suffered in Southern prisons, to the humane and kind treatment of friends in the loyal States.
