

ITEMS—GENERAL AND LOCAL.

The inmates of our Hospital have reason to congratulate themselves on the rapid progress evinced in our Band organization. Already music, sweet and harmonious, is wafted to our ears, and judging from the rapid progress thus far, we can safely say that in a few weeks we shall hear no discordant sounds.

The operations of our grand armies in the East and West are now claiming the attention of the entire North. Never in the history of the United States has there occurred a period in which anxiety and hope were so strongly united. Newspapers are seized with the greatest eagerness, and every item of intelligence studied. Let us hope and pray for a final triumph.

The Officers' Hospital, as authorized by General Order No. 127, War Dep't., A. G. O., Washington, D. C., March 29, 1864, has been established within the precincts of the Naval Academy, by order of Medical Director SIMPSON. The portion of our Hospital known as Sec. III, has been selected for sick and wounded officers, and has been thoroughly renovated and prepared for their reception. Already those under treatment have been transferred to the new location, and preparations have been made for all who may come.

A night school was opened a week ago to-day, in our commodious Mess Hall, for the benefit of all of our patients who are desirous of improving themselves in reading, writing, spelling, arithmetic, &c. Nearly seventy-five scholars were present on the opening night. Our lady nurses have volunteered their services as teachers, and generous friends in Utica have furnished us a large supply of books, slates, &c. The Sanitary Commission will complete our outfit, and we hope every patient who is able, and conscious of needing to improve his early education, will attend punctually and regularly.

Let every one endeavor to secure one of the card-pictures exhibiting the condition of many of our paroled prisoners, immediately upon their arrival here—and then we wish to be informed whether any observer will consider the reports hitherto circulated, exaggerated or colored in the least. After you have looked at the picture yourself, send it to your friends, choosing first any rebel sympathizer you may know. We are positive that all boasters of Southern chivalry will be compelled to hide their heads for shame. We are glad that Major General WALLACE and the Committee from Washington, on the Conduct of the War, when here last week, suggested the propriety of photographing the men in their actual condition as the best means of bringing before the people, the truth in the matter. ROSE, PARHAM, and BEEDLE have not died in vain. Their lives will be avenged.

Those of our inmates who live in the Northern and Eastern States have been surprised at the high degree of temperature in Annapolis during the past week. "Eighty-five degrees in the shade," has been passed around respecting the weather, and personal feelings always vouched for the correctness of the statement.—Vegetation has advanced wonderfully—seeing the grass grow has been literally true. The birds warble in the opening day, and the cool shade has been sought and appreciated by all the idlers, while the workers have had an unusual amount of perspiration to take care of.—What a privilege it is to have our lot as soldiers, cast in this beautiful location! We thought all winter that we should like to be away from this cold Bay; but now how delightful and refreshing are the breezes wafted over its surface! The poor crippled soldiers in the Tents, while lying on their beds, can look out upon the beautiful water, and for a time forget their sufferings, while the Richmond victims can, if able, approach the water's edge and breathe in the pure air of Heaven, with none to make them afraid. We think that they appreciate Liberty as few of us can, who know little of the trials of a long imprisonment. One of them, the other day upon being asked by a Lady how he felt to find himself in a clean comfortable bed, and every wish gratified, replied in the following forcible terms:—"Oh! madam, the difference is as great as between hell and Heaven."

Declaration of Exchange of Prisoners.

WAR DEPARTMENT,
ADJUTANT GENERAL'S OFFICE,
WASHINGTON, May 7, 1864.
General Orders, No. 191.

1. It having been officially reported that Mr. OULD, Rebel Commissioner of Exchange, has declared, without consulting with the authorities of the United States, that all Rebel prisoners delivered at City Point, up to the 20th of April, were exchanged, it is—

Ordered, That all Federal prisoners of war, and all civilians on parole prior to May 7th, 1864, be declared exchanged, and they are thus declared exchanged accordingly.

2. It is further announced, that after deducting the number of Federal officers and men embraced in this order, as exchanged, the Rebels will remain indebted to the Federal Government, according to tables carefully prepared by the Commissary General of Prisoners, from official data,—33,596,—for which no equivalents have been received by the Federal Government.

3. All paroled officers and enlisted men, herein declared exchanged, who are in camp, will be immediately forwarded by the commandants of camps, to their regiments and commands, and will be reported to the Commissary General of Prisoners, accordingly. Those who are absent on leave, will, on expiration of their leave, repair forthwith to the Parole Camps, at Annapolis, Maryland, or Columbus, Ohio.
