

A Soldiers Funeral.

The following notice will interest many sympathizing friends in this hospital, whose associations with "Jimmy Frecht," and his parents, are pleasant memories.—Ed.

The funeral of James Frecht, formerly of Company E, 1st Pa. Reserves, was attended yesterday afternoon by an immense concourse of citizens. The Union League Band, and a squad of his former comrades, under the command of his former captain, P. I. O'Rourke, buried him with appropriate honors. The beautiful weather and the excellent music of the band, no doubt, had the effect of bringing out a great many persons; but those who attended out of respect for one who gave his life for his country, never followed a braver young soldier to his last resting place, than was "Jimmy Frecht," as he was known by his comrades and acquaintances. He enlisted in his country's service, before he was eighteen years of age, for the unexpired term of the Pa. Reserves, but deceived by the recruiting officer, he was mustered in for three years, and was paid but twenty-five dollars of the bounty due him. Notwithstanding the deception and fraud practiced upon him, there was not a more heroic, patient, or cheerful soldier in the service. He joined the Reserves soon after the battle of Gettysburg, and was with them through all the engagements of the Wilderness, Spottsylvania, and Bethesda Church, and after he was transferred with the re-enlisted men of his regiment, to the newly organized veteran regiment, 190th, P. V., he participated in all the skirmishes and battles before Petersburg, with the 5th Corps, until he was captured, with nearly the whole of his regiment, near the Weldon railroad, on the 18th of August. He was confined on Belle Isle for two months, where, by the rebel process of treatment of our men, he was exposed and starved, and reduced to a mere skeleton, and when leaving Libby Prison Hospital, where he was placed a few days before his exchange, he was so weak that he fell down the steps, and was then picked up and thrown like a brute into the wagon to convey him to the depot. He arrived at Annapolis, Md., on the 9th of October, where he received the best treatment from our surgeons, and the kind attentions of his mother, for several weeks before his removal to his home, where in a few weeks more, he terminated his life. A terrible responsibility rests upon the officer who deceived and defrauded this noble young lad, and upon the wretches who ill-treated him during his imprisonment. A person could wish to know the individuals, and see the just retribution which cannot fail to follow them, but the brave youth has set us a better example. Forgetting the wrongs done him as an individual, he thought only of his duty to his country, and devoted his whole soul to its service. He was struck and stoned in the battle of the Wilderness, but remained on duty, and when he was captured, he made un-serviceable his beautiful Spencer rifle, a seven-shooter, which it was his pride to keep in complete order, by breaking the stock into splinters and bending the barrel. His desire to obey orders is evinced by a request he made the day before he died, that notice be sent to Annapolis of his inability to return at the expiration of his furlough. This is the career of a Lancaster patriot boy, and deserves to be held in grateful memory by the citizens of his native place. His parents and friends have the consolation of knowing that there was no better soldier in his country's service, and may his rest be such as was so beautifully sung at his grave, where, "Pain and sickness ne'er shall enter." "There is rest for you," noble patriot boy.
