PREFACE

This study records Maryland imprints from the year 1847 through 1849. It is part of a research project of the American Imprints Inventory to compile a complete national bibliography. There has long been interest in the history of American printing and the products of the early presses. By a nation-wide exploration of American libraries the American Imprints Inventory collected a mass of material essential to the history of the press in the United States and made possible the compilation of check-lists of state imprints.

A brief history of Maryland showing the economic and social background in which the printing was done and a sketch of printing and publishing during the period precede the check-list. The entries in the check-list are arranged chronologically by year and then alphabetically by author. The titles have been copied from the actual books listed. Libraries possessing copies of the works are indicated by symbols assigned to them by the National Union Catalog Division of the Library of Congress. A list of newspapers and periodicals published in Maryland during the period is included in the study. The index of authors and titles includes references to all the works listed.

The Maryland files of the American Imprints Inventory, the National Union Catalog, and bibliographies were used in compiling the check-list. Visits were made to libraries where the titles were checked with the actual copies. Uncataloged books were carefully searched for in each library and recorded. This work was greatly aided by the prompt replies received from librarians and private collectors, consulted by correspondence throughout the country, who kindly checked titles and supplied additional bibliographical information. Special acknowledgement is gratefully made to Mr. Fred Shelley

of the Maryland Historical Society and to Mr. Henry J. Fickus of Peabody Institute for their interest and cooperation in making available their entire library collections. A word of appreciation is extended to Mr. Charles G. LaHood and Miss May Gardner of the Library of Congress for their advice and assistance.

CHAPTER I

HISTORY OF MARYLAND

The Mexican War had become the main interest in Maryland by 1847. The citizens of Maryland always maintained the opinion that it was a just and necessary war on the part of the United States, and from the beginning of hostilities until peace negotiations were concluded between the United States and Mexico, the entire state concurred in giving support to the government in the prosecution of the war.

Although Texas had been recognized as an independent republic by the United States, England, France, and other countries for many years, Mexico still refused to acknowledge its independence. When the United States proposed to admit Texas into the Union, Mexico gave warning that the annexation would be considered an act of war. Mexico withdrew its minister and severed diplomatic relations with the United States shortly after the formal protest was made.¹ The immediate occasion of the war, however, was the dispute in regard to the western boundary of Texas. Upon admittance into the Union, the United States accepted the Rio Grande which was claimed by Texas as the boundary line instead of the Nueces River, one hundred miles eastward, which Mexico declared the boundary. A force of about three thousand men under General Zachary Taylor was ordered into the disputed territory, and a counter advance was made by the Mexicans. In protecting the claims of Texas to this territory, American troops were suddenly attacked on April 25, 1846. Thereupon, it was declared that war had been begun by the act of Mexico, and on May 13, 1846, the United States formally declared war.²

President James Polk called for two regiments of infantry, as the quota of volunteers from Maryland to serve in the war. The response was

great throughout the state, and more men volunteered than could be equipped. A battalion was formed, composed of four companies recruited in Baltimore and two from Washington, called the Battalion of Baltimore and Washington Volunteers.³

During the year 1847, campaigns were conducted by General Taylor along the Rio Grande, against Mexico City by General Scott, in California under Admiral Stockton and Captain Fremont, and in New Mexico by General Kearny. Maryland's citizens aided the superior forces of the United States to win every battle, although often outnumbered by the Mexicans who fought bravely. At Palo Alto, the skillful handling of the artillery by Major Samuel Ringgold of Maryland probably won the battle. Major Ringgold died from wounds received in this engagement and was succeeded in the command of the artillery by Captain Randolph Ridgesley, another Marylander. On March 29, 1847, Vera Cruz surrendered to the United States, and the Baltimore Battalion, assigned to the eastern defences of the city, had the honor to fire a salute for the victory.⁴ In September, 1847, the battalion took an active part in the capture of the National Bridge, considered one of the strongest passes in Mexico, from which numerous attacking parties had long harassed the advance of the American army.⁵

The fall of Mexico City on September 13, 1847, practically ended the war, but peace negotiations were not concluded until May 30, 1848, due to the fact that there was no recognized authority in Mexico. The treaty of Guadalupe-Hidalgo established peace between the United States and Mexico. By its provisions, the United States received more than 525,000 square miles of territory from which have been organized the states of California, Nevada, and Utah, and parts of Colorado, Arizona, New Mexico, and Wyoming; and the lower Rio Grande, from its mouth to El Paso, was taken as the boundary of Texas. In consideration of these acquisitions, the United States

paid Mexico fifteen million dollars.⁶ No state in the Union contributed more than Maryland in winning victory for the country, for its losses in men were greater than those sustained by any other state.

The entire country's attention was directed towards Baltimore in the spring of 1848, when both the Democratic National Convention and the Whig National Convention assembled in that city to nominate candidates for president and vice president of the United States. Because of his brilliant achievements as a commanding officer in the war with Mexico, General Zachary Taylor, who was nominated by the Whigs for the presidency, was easily the most popular candidate, and in the following November he was elected to administer the affairs of the country. Millard Fillmore was elected vice president.⁷ In the process of forming a cabinet, the new president gave the position of attorney-general of the United States to Reverdy Johnson of Maryland, one of the most eminent lawyers in the country.⁸

The history of Maryland is little but a record of peace and rapidly growing prosperity in the years after the Mexican War. It was during the administration of Governor Philip F. Thomas, a native of the Eastern Shore, who, on the Democratic ticket was elected governor in the fall of 1847, that the state cleared itself of one of its greatest financial difficulties.⁹ As result of the sound economic policy that Governor Thomas and his predecessor vigorously pursued, Maryland's credit was restored, and the state was able to pay interest on all its debts.

Dazzled by the prospects of an almost unlimited expansion of commerce, Maryland had entered too rashly upon a policy of public improvements, and subscribed for many millions of stocks, raising the funds by loans at home and abroad, and pledging the credit of the state for both principal and

interest. The consequence was that after the great financial crash of 1837, when the whole country seemed about to be plunged into bankruptcy, Maryland found itself unable to meet its obligations, and in 1842, was driven to the extremity of suspending the payment of interest to its creditors. Governor Thomas realized that the state's credit had to be maintained at all costs, even though the policy involved a heavy increase in taxation, and he used all his influence to carry appropriate legislation through the General Assembly. George Peabody, once a citizen of Maryland, who had been one of the commissioners to negotiate the loans in London where most of the money had been raised, and whose reputation as a banker in England stood high, used successfully his great influence to build up the credit of the state - for all which services he refused any compensation.¹⁰

The citizens of the state finally saw the necessity of increased taxation and greater economy in expenditures; and gradually the condition of the state treasury improved. In 1843, Governor Thomas announced to the General Assembly that regular payment on the state debt was resumed, Maryland's credit was entirely restored, and the state's stocks were once more sought after by capitalists in this country and in Europe as secure and profitable investments.¹¹

Once financial conditions improved, public attention was again directed towards internal development. During this period many internal improvements that had been started in the early years of the decade were hastening to completion. The importance of opening up the state to trade and settlement was early recognized, and since the early part of the century the state had encouraged the construction of roads, canals, and improvements in the water courses that facilitated internal commerce.¹² Railroads had been in use for some years; now interest was focused on building them up on a scale commensurate with the wealth and commercial importance of the state.

Many towns were eager to share the benefits of the new invention -- the telegraph.

By an act of the legislature of Maryland the first telegraph company was incorporated in February, 1848, under the name, "The Magnetic Telegraph Company." The first telegraph line erected between Cumberland and Baltimore was completed in December of the same year. The Western Telegraph Company was permanently organized in 1849. The lines of this company extended from Washington to Frederick. The Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, at that time one of the most stupendous railroad works of its kind ever undertaken on the American continent, was engaged in extending its road through Cumberland to the Ohio River.¹³

Maryland had always been essentially an agricultural state, having on the whole an exceedingly fertile soil. However, over a period of years much of the rich soil became impoverished by the continual planting of the staple crops, corn and tobacco, without a system of cultivation. During this period agricultural societies were formed in many counties, and the art of the cultivation of the soil ensued. The land quickly paid dividends. Frederick became the richest agricultural county in the state. By the end of the decade, very little or none of its land was uncultivated. The county was the leading wheat region in the state, and it had some of the best stock and dairy farms in the country. The land in Harford and Montgomery counties was of the same general quality, producing abundantly vegetables and fruit crops. In 1849, a state agricultural association was organized to work with the county societies in improving farming conditions.¹⁴ The oyster industry was then at its peak. Since the oyster packing business was established in 1834, every year bushels of oysters were taken from the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries for packing and shipment.¹⁵

Maryland's location as a border state made for association with the

industrial progress of the middle states, in addition to the agricultural pursuits of the South. Although New York was taking over control of the foreign shipping, making Baltimore a way station in the main stream of commerce, manufacturing and domestic trade were profiting. Maryland possessed great waterpower in its swiftly flowing streams, and water was abundantly supplied at exceedingly low rates to manufacturing plants. Manufacturers found it advantageous to locate their establishments in Baltimore and its vicinity, where labor was cheap and manufacturing plants were exempt from local taxation. Manufactures included shipbuilding, clothing, iron and steel, and machine shop products.¹⁶

By the end of the 1840's, Maryland's school system had undergone many changes since the opening of the first public school in Baltimore in 1829. At the beginning of the new decade it became evident that the organization and management of the system needed a thorough revision. The board of commissioners which was appointed to bring about the necessary changes concluded that the school system was incomplete and the system of instruction was faulty. As a result, in 1847, the studies in the high schools were arranged in eight departments. In 1847 and 1848, women teachers were appointed in some of the schools with marked success, and the results settled the future policy of the system with reference to their employment in schools from which they had previously been excluded. In the latter year the division of the lower schools into primary and grammar grades was accomplished, and the necessary buildings and equipment were provided.¹⁷

The Cumberland Academy was built in 1849.¹⁸

The first superintendent of schools was appointed in 1849, in Baltimore, at which time the board said that it considered this act, "one of the most important improvements which has ever been made to the public school system." Reverend John N. McJilton, who was selected for the position,

served for a period of seventeen years.¹⁹ Although the various measures dealing with public education which had been enacted during the first half of the century improved the schools, no general and effective system was established until the creation of the state board of education in 1864.²⁰

The United States Naval Academy was in a similar period of growth. The Academy was established in Annapolis in 1845, and no sooner had the institution got into running order than the Mexican War opened. Many midshipmen and instructors were detached for active duty, leaving the institution in a state of confusion. When the war ended, the curriculum was reorganized, for the course of study was not yet well defined and the work of naval instruction was elementary.²¹

During the period there were several associations and societies that encouraged interest in literary and cultural pursuits. The Mercantile Library Association, composed of young men who felt the necessity for greater facilities for mental improvement than the city then afforded, provided lectures and reading material of a high character for its members and the citizens of Baltimore. The Maryland Institute for the Promotion of the Mechanic Arts was organized for the second time in 1848. The members presented lectures on subjects connected with the mechanic arts and collected a library of works on mechanics and the sciences that was one of the institute's greatest attractions. In 1849, the board of managers extended the usefulness of the institute by opening a school of design. In the next year a school of bookkeeping and writing was established. The institute was supported by fees from its members and by small annual appropriations from the state. The library of the Maryland Historical Society was opened to the members of the society and the public on May 29, 1848. The library contained at that time a great number of manuscripts and the largest collection of Maryland newspapers in existence.

The growth of the taste for works of art in Baltimore had been gradual and without any important manifestations in the way of organization until the formation of the Maryland Art Association on March 5, 1848, which was designed to be an association of professional artists and amateurs of the city for promoting the knowledge and practice of fine arts in Maryland. There are no records to show how long the association continued, but it was the beginning of that development in the study and encouragement of fine arts which has since that time had such success in all parts of the state.²²

The original settlers of Maryland were Catholics, and the state had retained to some extent the Catholic character that marked its early settlement. Baltimore was the seat of government of the Catholic Church in the United States. That city had the largest number of Catholics in the state. During the last two decades there had been a great flood of immigration from Europe to this country. Many of the Irish and German immigrants who settled in Baltimore were members of the Church.²³ However, all the leading denominations were represented in Maryland. In Annapolis, the Methodists and Presbyterians dominated the religious field. The Evangelical Lutheran Church was the center of Christian influence in Frederick county.²⁴

The citizens of Maryland had made plans to clear the state of one more important problem before the end of 1849. For more than thirty years, a large majority of the people had been ineffectually importuning the legislature to give them opportunity to revise the state constitution. Bills directing the call of a convention for that purpose had been often passed by the House and rejected by the Senate. In accordance with the recommendations of Governor Thomas, in December, 1849, a committee was appointed to report a bill to provide for the call of a convention to revise the constitution.

The bill passed both houses in February, 1850. In the following November a constitutional convention assembled in Annapolis, and in 1851, the state adopted a new constitution.²⁵

Maryland prospered greatly during the period, 1847-1849. There was something almost miraculous about the vitality of the state in the late 1840's. Its soldiers had taken a gallant stand in the war with Mexico, and the country was once more at peace. The gloom that had at one time overspread the state in regard to the public debt was removed. Payment on the state debt was resumed, Maryland's credit was established, and property was redoubled. Agriculture, commerce, and manufacturing were profiting. Fertility had been restored to the once impoverished soil in many farming communities, and agricultural societies were improving farming conditions in all parts of the state. With the South, especially, due to the increasing use of cotton in the mills, the state's commercial ties were growing. When the period ended, the citizens of Maryland were looking forward to greater prosperity in the next decade.

CHAPTER II

PRINTING AND PUBLISHING IN MARYLAND

Printing was introduced into Maryland at an early date in the history of American printing. The first printing press in the state was set up by William Nuthead in Saint Mary's City in 1685. His wife, Dinah Nuthead, in 1695, did the first printing in Annapolis, the town to which she moved soon after her husband's death. Maryland's next printer was Thomas Reading, who began work in Annapolis in 1700. John Peter Zenger had a press in Chestertown in 1720 and 1721. For the next few years Maryland's printing had to be done in Philadelphia. Then in 1726, William Parks came to Annapolis from England and was made public printer. In 1727, Parks issued at Annapolis the first number of the Maryland Gazette, the first newspaper printed in the state. Nicholas Hasselbach brought the first printing press to Baltimore in July, 1765.¹

During the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries printing developed in all parts of the state. By the late 1840's, Baltimore had become the center of the printing industry in Maryland. More printers, publishers, and booksellers were established in that city than in any other town or city in the state. This period witnessed the first success of the penny newspaper in Baltimore. The advent of the penny paper, ten years earlier, enlarged Maryland's reading public and brought about advances in printing and publishing.²

Arunah Abell's name appears in the imprint of several almanacs printed in Maryland during the years of this study. His greatest success, however, was not achieved as a book printer, but as publisher of the Sun, the leading daily newspaper in the state during the period. Abell was born in Providence, Rhode Island, August 10, 1806. His education was received in his native town,

where in 1820, he became an apprentice in a newspaper office. When his apprenticeship ended, he moved to Boston and readily obtained employment as foreman in a large printing establishment. After a short career in Boston he went to New York, where he was now able to become proprietor of his own business. Here he studied journalism, and a few years later he and two fellow-printers established as joint ownership a newspaper in that city and in Philadelphia. The venture did not meet with the success that they had hoped, but Abell, not easily discouraged, in 1835, opened a printing office in Baltimore and printed books there for a number of years.³

Since Abell's principal interest was in the newspaper business, he immediately made plans to establish a daily newspaper in Baltimore. On the morning of May 17, 1837, he published the first issue of the Sun. From the very first issue the paper emphasized the reporting of local news. There were six daily newspapers published in the city at the time, all of which sold for six cents. Abell offered his paper for one cent, so it was within the means of the masses. The result was that the circulation of the Sun swiftly outran that of any other Baltimore daily newspaper.

With the outbreak of hostilities in Mexico, the chief source of news swung to the South, and local news became momentarily far less important. Throughout the years of the war, Abell made every effort to inform the citizens of Maryland of news from the battlefields. In order to transmit news rapidly from the seat of the war, it was necessary to employ and coordinate every available means of communication, as there were no continuous telegraph lines and railroad systems were fragmentary. In spite of the handicaps in communication, the Sun's coverage of the Mexican War was far more copious than that of any previous war by any paper in the world.⁴

On April 10, 1847, the Sun was the first to inform the president of the United States and the citizens of Baltimore that the army had captured

the city of Vera Cruz, thereby practically insuring victory. This was the biggest news story to appear in a newspaper column up to that time. Not only the mails, but even the official couriers of the War Department were surpassed by the Sun's pony express service. This unparalleled effort of newspaper enterprise was heralded in all sections of the country. The importance of the daily press as a source of early and accurate national news was fully recognized.⁵

Niles' Weekly Register was the most noted weekly publication in Maryland during the first half of the nineteenth century. Although the Register was commonly considered a newspaper, it was actually a news magazine mainly devoted to the publication of official documents, governmental reports, congressional speeches, and the significant news of national interest. The periodical achieved an excellent reputation and had a circulation extending to many parts of the world. It was founded in 1811, by Hezekiah Niles who was the editor and publisher for twenty-five years. His eldest son, William Ogden Niles, published the Register for the next three years, at the end of which time, Jeremiah Hughes became the publisher.⁶

Hughes was active in Maryland journalism for more than thirty years. For many years he edited the Maryland Republican, published at the state capital, and at one time had a printing office in Baltimore.⁷ However, he took over the Register under inauspicious circumstances, and under his ownership the periodical declined in vigor and influence until it ceased to exist. The February 26, 1848, edition was the last issue published in Baltimore, for by that time Hughes had decided that he no longer felt equal to the task of continuing the Register under adverse financial conditions. In July, 1848, the periodical was purchased by George Beatty, and its offices moved to Philadelphia, where, on September 28, 1849, it ceased publication.⁸ The Register's long life of thirty-eight years in a period when many periodicals

failed to last even one year has been called an extraordinary achievement.

John Murphy was proprietor of the most prosperous publishing firm in Maryland during the period of this study. Murphy was born in Ireland, March 12, 1812. He came to this country in 1822, and learned printing in Delaware and Philadelphia, where he became thoroughly familiar with the trade. In 1835, he set up a printing press in Baltimore and two years later founded the firm, John Murphy and Company.⁹ His firm achieved a high reputation for the excellence of its publications which included a large number of juvenile, school, and Catholic works. Its trade for the latter extended to all parts of the country as well as to Europe, South America, and Australia. The establishment was equipped with all kinds of printing material, including a large and varied assortment of modern types. Besides books, Murphy published in Baltimore from 1841 to 1848, a religious periodical called the United States Catholic Magazine and Monthly Review.¹⁰

Fielding Lucas, Jr. was at one time an extensive publisher of Catholic works. However, during this period his business was declining, and his name appeared on fewer books each year. Lucas was born in Fredericksburg, Virginia, September 3, 1781. He first entered business in Philadelphia. In 1806, in Baltimore, he formed the firm of Conrad, Lucas, and Company, of which he shortly became the sole proprietor. He operated a type foundry, but during his career he printed few of his own books. In the late 1840's, John D. Toy's name appears as printer on most of his works. Up to the beginning of the decade, Lucas was the leading Catholic publisher in the state. He was an Episcopalian, but he attended the Catholic Church for many years, and on his deathbed in March, 1854, he was received into the Church.¹¹

Most of the music publishing in Maryland during this period was done by George Willig, Jr., and Frederick D. Benteen. Willig was associated with his father in a publishing firm in Philadelphia and Baltimore for many years.

In 1829, his father, being fully occupied by the Philadelphia business, put the Baltimore establishment into the hands of his Philadelphia-born son. Willig continued the business under his name until 1868, when his sons Henry and Joseph E. Willig were added to the firm which then became George Willig and Company. He was active in the firm until his death on December 10, 1874.¹² Very little is known about Frederick Benteen. In May, 1839, he succeeded John Cole, one of the earliest music publishers in Baltimore, and in ten years he was one of the leading music publishers in the country. William Miller and Joseph Beacham issued a few music titles under the name of the firm, Miller & Beacham.¹³ The Mexican War provided the theme for many of the songs published during the period.

William Minifie and Company was a publishing firm that was active in a small way in Baltimore. The firm was founded in 1847, by William Minifie and his son J. Woodfin Minifie, who took over the sole management of the firm after the death of the father in 1880. The firm's specialties were books on art, architecture, engineering, and mechanics.¹⁴ Richard J. Matchett operated a bookstore and printing shop where he printed with uncommon accuracy the Baltimore Directory, his principal achievement, which afforded Baltimore's citizens much necessary information for the advancement of their commercial industries.

Joseph Robinson was a prominent printer in Baltimore for many years. He was born in Frederick, Maryland, in 1787. At a young age he left his home town and went to Baltimore where he learned the printing trade. As early as 1810, the Baltimore Directory lists him as a printer and proprietor of a circulating library. Robinson was an enthusiastic adherent of Freemasonry, and from 1842 to 1862, he served as grand secretary of a Maryland chapter. He printed many of the fraternity's publications in the late 1840's, and throughout his career Masonic publications formed a great part of the output

of his press. School and college catalogues formed another important class of his works. He continued his business in Baltimore until his death in March, 1863.¹⁵

David Schley and Thomas Haller were the outstanding printers in Frederick during this period. In 1847, they formed a partnership and began issuing books from the Examiner Office. In the same year they succeeded John Williams as publishers of the Examiner, the largest and most widely circulated newspaper published in western Maryland. The firm did not last long, for Schley died in 1852, and ten years later on account of ill health, Haller was forced to sell his interest in the firm. George Baltzell was entering the industry in Frederick about this time. In addition to operating a printing shop, he was a teacher in the public schools.¹⁶

Johann Gruber was one of the first German printers in the state. He settled in Hagerstown in 1794, and in 1796, he issued the first copy of the Hagerstown Town and Country Almanac which he continued to print during the years of this study. Gruber, the eldest son of Dr. Everard Gruber of Lancaster, Pennsylvania, was born October 31, 1768. Early in life he decided in favor of a mechanical trade, rather than the medical profession which his father wished him to follow. Accordingly, at the age of fifteen he was apprenticed to a printer in Philadelphia. When his apprenticeship terminated, he worked in a printing office in that city and later in Reading, Pennsylvania. Before setting up his printing press in Hagerstown, he printed German newspapers in several towns in Pennsylvania.¹⁷

The Hagerstown Almanac was widely circulated in the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, for during part of that period, the Bible and almanacs were the only reading matter in many households. The almanac was first printed in German. The English edition was begun in 1822, and as Maryland's foreign-born gradually adopted the English language, the German edition became smaller

and was issued less regularly. The press that Gruber used in printing the almanac was made and purchased in Philadelphia and was used until the end of his career in Hagerstown.¹⁸

During his long career as a printer Gruber trained many young men in the trade. One of them was Daniel May, his son-in-law, who in 1811, entered into partnership in his business. Although only Gruber's name appears on the almanac, May is known to have been responsible for much of the editing and typesetting in the late 1840's, for by that time Gruber was becoming less active in the business. William Stewart also learned the printing trade from Gruber. During this period he issued his productions from his own printing shop in Hagerstown and in the next decade was associated with Gruber. Gruber died in his ninetieth year of age on December 29, 1857, two years after he retired from business.¹⁹

Der Deutsche Correspondent was the leading German newspaper in Maryland during this period. It was founded in Baltimore in 1841, by Frederick Raine as a small weekly publication. Within one year it was being issued bi-weekly, and in 1848, it became a first class daily paper. The Correspondent was one of the first German newspapers in the United States that made the reporting of important domestic and foreign news its chief aim. The publication in full in the German language of important official documents and governmental reports was always an important feature. The paper had a circulation extending to all parts of the state.²⁰

In addition to publishing Der Deutsche Correspondent, Frederick Raine issued books from his press. He had a complete outfit of printing materials for printing in both the English and German languages. A large number of religious works were included among his publications. Raine descended from a family well-known in the publishing field. In his native Germany his father was a newspaper publisher for many years, and when he immigrated to this

country several years in advance of Raine, he revived here his former business. It was in his father's newspaper office in Baltimore that Raine received his first education in journalism. After becoming thoroughly familiar with the newspaper business, he began on February 6, 1841, the publication of Der Deutsche Correspondent. Raine was connected with many civic and industrial enterprises in Baltimore. In 1848, he was a member of the Baltimore City Council.

Although we have commented mostly on the printing activities in Baltimore, there were successful printers actively engaged in the trade in many towns in the state. However, there has been little study of their work during this period, and the only record that we have of most of them is a catalogue of what they printed.

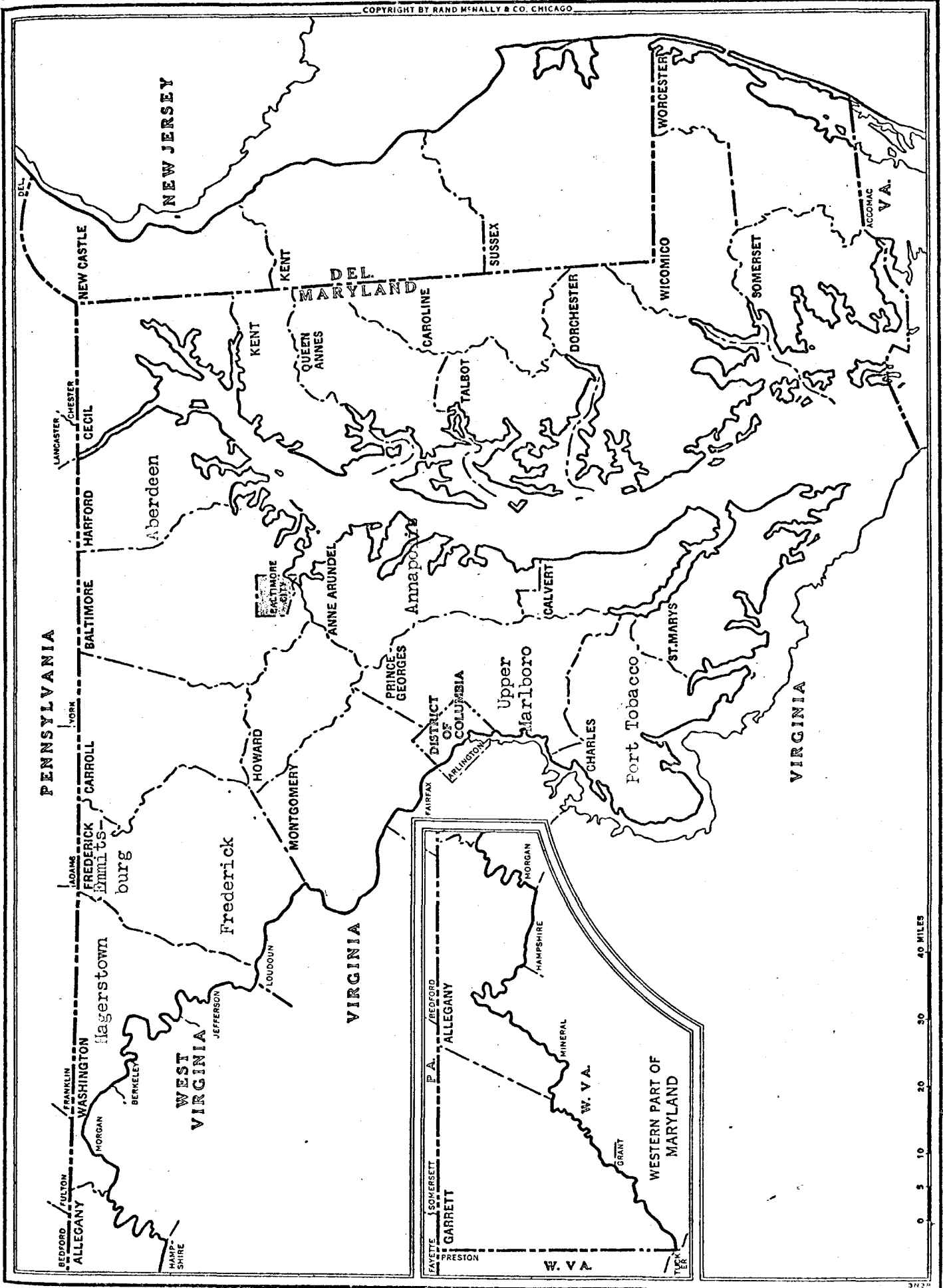
