- Letter sent to him by corp concerning ruinous condition of buildings in town. Carrall replies court can destroy house occupied by Samuel Jackson, but Carroll will repair the rest AR 6 180
- 1780 Councilman AR 5 194

- 1783 Chosen alderman (of Carrallton) AR 9 30
- 1784 Chosen Alderman AR 15 12
- 1784 Chosen city " MCP#6 p 24
