Nov. 26, 1790: Charles Carroll of Carrollton, re-elected to U.S. Senate from the Western Shore

Nov. 30, 1792: letter from Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, announcing the resignation of his seat in the United States Senate, was read in the House.

his death commented on in Journal of House 1836?

26 November 1790: "The senate being ready to proceed to the election of a senator to represent this state in the senate of the U.S., Chas. Carroll of Carrollton, Esq, being in nomination, begged leave to withdraw, and upon leave being given, withdrew accordingly." Carroll received 45 votes, Wm. Forrest 30.

30 November 1796 Carroll + J. T. Chase were appointed Commissioners to ascertain the western and southern boundaries of the state with Virginia. Carroll resigned 11 December 1801
