in the same Year a Petition was filed

A Counter Petition was filed the next day by the Com-
plainants Counsel and on the 18th a Bill of Review
was filed on behalf of the defendant - on these applications
Subsequent to the Decree no order was passed by the late
Chancellor and the Case having been mentioned to the
Present Chancellor at February Term last the Petition
aforesaid of the Complainants was laid before him
in June last, on which he stated in Writing that the
would during the ensuing July Term hear any Motion
respecting the said Petition, on Notice being given

At July Term the Parties were fully heard as to the
Subjection of the first Petition by the defendant (the
Bill of Review being abandoned). The Chancellor after
this argument considering the said Petition as virtually
continued from Term to Term and therefore as being
of the same Term at which the Decree was made had
no doubt of the absolute Propriety of granting a Rehearing
the same difficulty arose respecting the additional evidence
and the amendments which might be necessary to afford
a ground for it, but it was at length ordered that the Decree
should be opened for the Purpose of having the Cause
heard at the Present Term subject to further Order as to any
further Testimony or Alteration in the defence that might
be then offered

The Cause was accordingly brought on to be heard at this Term and an amendment to the answer was offered, but the Counsel not agreeing in the admission of facts proposed by the defendant to be admitted. The amendment was withdrawn and the trial came on with only the additional evidence of the will of Daniel of St Thomas Jenifer and the Statement taken as an exhibit in the answer.

The Chancellor is not at present ^{satisfied} ~~satisfied~~ of any material effect which this exhibit could have in the case if the proposed amendment had been made - as the defense now stands he considers it as making no difference and producing no benefit to the defendant and therefore the case is before him in the same manner as it was before the late Chancellor.

He has taken a considerable time to look into the Subject, because altho the must necessarily consider the former some entitled to great weight and respect yet the ^{most} ~~should~~ ^{must} consider it his duty not to rely on it without examination but to do as his predecessor himself would have done that is to rehear the cause and to make a different decision if he find the same to be fraudulent and erroneous. The Paper marked B on which the demand of the complainant rests is not very intelligible in itself, but when explained by the other exhibits and the proceedings in the cause it amounts clearly to an agreement as stated in the Bill by Daniel of St Thomas Jenifer to allow to the complainant the sum that Thomas Stone had paid for the share in the Iron Works - to deduct his (Jenifer's) share on his Bond and to pay the Balance - and also

to Pay the surplus, if on a Sale of said Share any should
arise. and by necessary inference to take the Share as Security

The Complainants State that they consented to this
agreement and afterwards conveyed the Share under
that Trust and Confidence; But the Defendant Alleges
that this Conveyance which was made on the 4th of January
1790 was a full absolute and unconditional Transfer
of the said Share and exhibits that instrument - 2. 4 -

And there are certainly Circumstances to induce a presump-
tion that such was the fact but not of sufficient
force to ^{amount to the being} ~~admit~~ of Proof against the written en-
gagement of Jenifer - Four Months and a half

had elapsed between the signing of that Engagement
and the Execution of the Conveyance or Transfer - The
first part of the Consideration is that of Jenifer having
given up and cancelled the Bond in question which seems

repugnant to the idea of the Transfer being made as a
Security - The Agreement which was before equal was
themselves in a situation to become otherwise, as if the
Property had not appreciated Jenifer might have lost a

part of his debt and the subjected himself to a Contract
by which the might lose and could not gain - Yet
Persons who are Capable of transacting their own business
must be permitted to make their Contracts as they think proper

It must be observed also that (except these Circumstances)
no evidence is produced by the Defendant which might
lead to any certain opinion Altho there were two Witnesses
to the Transfer - These Witnesses might have known and

explained what took place if all the Parties were present
and might have determined a ^{Question} ~~Point~~ that was litigated in
the Course of the argument Court whether the Engagement

of Jennifer Marked C was produced ^{at the time of the transfer} & the knowledge of which might be very material - It was contended for the Complainants that the transfer was in consequence of the agreement in August 1789 and that it must have been produced from the correspondence of the sum - There is certainly reason to believe either that it was produced or that the Parties must have recollecting and known the contents.

If the Parties were assembled and that Paper produced the leaving it in possession of the Complainants would be a strong circumstance in favour of their Claim.

But without a full knowledge ^{by the Court} on this subject it is certain that Jennifer had it in his power if he meant the transfer to be absolute to call in his Engagement ^{of August 1789} before the parties with the Bond and supposing him (if the case is as stated by the Defendant) to have neglected so to do, it has placed him under the obligation from which without further proof this Court cannot relieve him. It is probable from the disposition made in his will that he did not consider the Property as bound.

An objection was made at the Hearing by the Defendant to the accounts returned by the Auditor or particularly to that Marked E - and the Chancellor has therefore examined with great attention all the accounts. When a Party is entitled to an account it cannot be contended that any Memorandum of a Balance made out for the purpose of settlement is to prevent the ascertainment of the right sum by the correction of any errors or transposition.

The error first pointed out will be perceived in the Paper C - in which the settlement is made to the 30th of May and the interest on the share in the Iron Works calculated only to the 11th - The difference is only £ 6 - 19 - 1/2. Another correction is in charging the Defendant with

£184-17-6 which the Complainants had not been credited with - This will be perceived by recurring to the Defendants Exhibit No 2 in which that sum is credited to the Complainants as Executors of Thomas Stone (with the addition of 19/2 for interest) - and then two sums amounting to £185-16-8 are deducted from the estimate of the share in the Iron Works as having been sold in 1789 and credited to Thomas Stone - Yet the debt therein stated as due 30th May 1789 to wit £1363-11-2 is the same that is on the Debit Side of Exhibit No 2 - without deducting therefrom the Credit which it contains of £185-16-8 on account of which the share aforesaid was estimated at 6 months less.

The Dividends received after the transfer in January 1790th are certainly a proper charge as well as the amount of the sales on the principle that Jemifer was to repay all sums beyond the amount of the debt due to him. And if ^{single} ~~any~~ account should be stated charging the Complainants with the Bond and giving Credit for the estimated value of the share of the Iron Works and the actual receipts flowing from ~~their~~ ^{his} share of the Iron Works and other Payments as appearing on the Papers the result would be the same as that in the account &

DANIEL OF ST. THOMAS JENIFER

Daniel of St. Thomas Jenifer was born in Charles County 1723, the youngest child of Dr. Daniel Jenifer and Elizabeth Mason Rogers. His family had been in the colony for generations and he was related to many families of Southern Maryland.

Jenifer began his service in the Lower House from 1754 to 1757. In 1766, he was appointed Justice of Peace and one of the commissioners to settle the boundary dispute between Maryland and Pennsylvania that resulted in the Mason-Dixon Line. Jenifer was Agent and Receiver General for the Proprietor, 1768-1769. From 1771-1774, he was a member of the Governor's Council. He became, however, an active participant in the Maryland Revolutionary tribunals. From 1775-1777, he was President of the Council of Safety while from 1777-1781, he was a member and President of the Senate. A delegate to the Continental Congress, 1778-1782, he was sent again to Philadelphia in 1787 as a delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

Apart from his roll in drafting the United States Constitution, Jenifer's greatest service was as Intendant of Revenue, an office created for him by the legislature in November 1781. As Intendant he was granted almost unlimited

power accounting for all the state revenues. He superintended officers who collected state funds, examined public debts, all contracts and expenditures. Only under his order could money be drawn from the State Treasury after consultation with the Governor. He was so successful that the General Assembly curtailed his authority in 1785 but only after he had brought the rampant inflation of the war years under effective control.

In many ways, Jenifer was to Maryland what Robert Morris was to the nation except that Jenifer was far more prudent than Morris in his personal economy. Jenifer died a solvent and much honored man in Annapolis, 1790.
