Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Winder Disharoon all other of my lands on the north side of Tonatank Creek be them known by whatsoever name they may be to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. It is my will and desire that all my daughters shall have a home in the houses of any of my lands so long as they live single.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my two grand children Thomas Morris and Nancy Morris each twenty five dollars to be applied toward schooling of them, all the rest of my property to be equally divided between all of my children which may be living at the time of my death, and whereas, I expect when I do die not to owe any debt, it is my wish and desire that my wife shall divide all the property according to this my will without any administration on my estate, and should she not live to see that, it's equally done as herein I desire it's my will that my son Caleb shall do it in her room, my object is to avoid any disputes or any expences on my estate after my death - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 1814
