

Governor Takes A Bow On Release Of Book^{Eve. Sun}

Governor McKeldin and the Maryland Historical Society were jointly honored today on the date of the official release of the Governor's new book "Washington Bowed."

Both the Governor and a group of representatives from the historical society were guests of the Advertising Club of Baltimore at a luncheon and reception at the Hotel Emerson.

Mr. McKeldin, an avid student of history, discussed his book which relates how General Washington bowed to the authority of the Continental Congress at Annapolis shortly after the War for Independence ended.

The Governor was presented with an autographed copy of "From the Danube to the Yalu" written by Gen. Mark Clark, a gavel fashioned from wood taken from the steeple of the historic

Old North Church in Boston, and a bound volume of letters from governors of other states congratulating him on the publication of his latest book.

Wood Is Salvaged

Wood for the beautifully done gavel was salvaged from the Old North Church steeple after it was blown down during Hurricane Carol in August, 1954.

Twenty-six guests were at the head table including former Mayor Howard Jackson, Senator Louis Goldstein, States Attorney Anselm Sodaro, Police Commissioner James M. Hepbron and W. C. Sawyer, vice president of the Freedom Foundation, Valley Forge, Pa.

William F. Hilgenberg, president of the Advertising Club, presided over the luncheon while Robert Welch was chairman of the day's program.
