

Ogden Nash Wins TV Guess: It's Teddy In A Calvert Dress

Governor and Mrs. McKeldin, bewigged and tricked out in authentic Seventeenth Century costumes, last night made a surprise appearance on a national television quiz program — and were detected by a former Baltimorean, Ogden Nash.

The Governor had kept the secret of his forthcoming appearance as Lord Baltimore very well, but Mr. Nash, humorous poet and panellist on ABC's "Masquerade Party," spotted the Governor.

Bobby Sherwood, another panel member, asked the teetotal Governor if his face had ever been seen on a bottle of whisky, and said, "Are you one of the Calverts?"

Buff Cobb suggested that the Governor was in politics in "the State of Baltimore" and might be a senator.

"He couldn't disguise his well-known tones and that splendid speaking voice," Mr. Nash said later. "I wouldn't have dared come back to Baltimore if I hadn't spotted him."

The Governor, divested of his wig, told the audience that he was in New York to collect an award from the Jewish Federation of Men's Clubs, and would be going on to Boston today to receive a another interracial award.

Asked what charity he wished to benefit from the \$237 (a dollar for each second) donated by the program, the Governor named the Youth Alayah of Hadassah, the Zionist women's group.
