House Resolution No. 52-By The Ways and Means Committee:

Resolution commending the Honorable Louis L. Goldstein, Comptroller of the Treasury of the State of Maryland, and the Honorable Benjamin F. Marsh, Chief of the Maryland Income Tax Division, for their efforts toward having the State of Delaware amend its income tax law so as to eliminate an inequity which affected many residents of Maryland who are employed within the State of Delaware.

Whereas, since 1957 an inequitable situation has existed in the income tax laws of the State of Delaware which has affected some three to four thousand residents of Maryland who are employed within Delaware: and

WHEREAS, for the past several years much timeand effort has been expended by the Honorable Louis L. Goldstein, Comptroller of the Treasury of the State of Maryland, and the Honorable Benjamin F. Marsh, Chief of the Maryland Income Tax Division, toward having the State of Delaware amend its income tax law to eliminate the inequity; and

Whereas, this effort has necessitated numerous trips to Dover, Delaware, with appearances before the committees of the Delaware General Assembly, conferences with the Attorney General of Delaware in Wilmington, much correspondence with various Members of the Delaware General Assembly, and the Governor of Delaware, as well as the preparation of articles on the subject which have appeared in the Press of Delaware; and

WHEREAS, all of this time and effort has finally resulted into remedial legislation enacted by the Delaware General Assembly, which will go a long way toward eliminating the inequity and thus prove beneficial to many of our Maryland residents; now therefore

Be it Resolved by the House of Delegates of Maryland, That we commended the Honorable Louis L. Goldstein and the Honorable Benjamin F. Marsh, for the efforts that they have made in the interest of citizens of Maryland in having the State of Delaware amend its income tax law to eliminate an inequity therein which affected may residents of Maryland who are employed within the State of Delaware; and
