

GOLDSTEIN BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION

MONDAY, MARCH 14, 1994 IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING SESSION IN HOUSE CHAMBER
SERGEANT-AT-ARMS ANNOUNCED THE SENATE.

UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND MARCHING BAND FORMED TWO PARALLEL COLUMNS
IN HALL BETWEEN SENATE AND HOUSE CHAMBERS. SENATE PRESIDENT WALKED
ACROSS WITH SENATORS FOLLOWING WHILE THE BAND PLAYED. SENATORS
FANNED OUT AROUND SIDES OF CHAMBER.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS ANNOUNCED THE COMPTROLLER. THE BAND PLAYED "THE
MARINE HYMN."

THE COMPTROLLER WALKED TO ROSTRUM WHERE THE GOVERNOR, THE SPEAKER,
THE SENATE PRESIDENT, AND THE COMPTROLLER'S FAMILY AWAITED. BAND
ENTERED AND MARCHED DOWN AISLE TO EAST SIDE OF ROSTRUM PLAYING
"MARYLAND FIGHT SONG".
