Governor Appoints Judges in Prince George's

■ Gov. Parris N. Glendening (D) appointed three judges to the Prince George's County bench yesterday, filling one vacancy and two new judgeships created by the General Assembly.

Toni Clarke, 39, a former associate county attorney and interim state's attorney in Prince George's, was named to a new opening on the Circuit Court. She is president-elect of the county bar association.

Deputy State's Attorney Beverly Woodard, 46, was appointed to the District Court, where she takes a seat vacated by a judge who was elevated to the Circuit Court. Woodard has been a prosecutor in Prince George's since 1986.

Joel D. Worshtil, 51, a judicial officer who has presided over domestic cases in Prince George's since 1989, was selected for a new District Court judgeship. He served formerly with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission in Washington and as president of the Prince George's Law Foundation.
