Teen seized in burglary:

Anne Arundel County police arrested one teen-ager and were seeking two others in a burglary at the home of Mark Thieme, 29, the son of a Circuit Court judge, who recently was released from a hospital after being shot at his home Sept. 5.

Police said when Mark Thieme, of the 500 block of Riverside Drive in Pasadena, entered his home Sunday he found three youths, one a relative, in a room. He ordered them to leave and called police.

Later, police arrested a 15-year-old and recovered some jewelry that had been stolen. The youth was released to the custody of his parents.

On Sept. 5, Mark Thieme was shot in the chest with a shotgun during what police first believed was the careless handling of the weapon.

Originally, police were told the victim was handing the weapon to his wife, Renee, 35, when it accidentally discharged.

Mark Thieme, son of Anne Arundel Circuit Judge Raymond G. Thieme Jr., was taken to the Shock-Trauma Unit in Baltimore, where he remained until recently discharged.

After an investigation, police issued a warrant charging Renee Thieme with attempted murder. A few days later, she was arrested in Pennsylvania, where she was living with relatives.

Renee Thieme waived extradition last week and was returned to Anne Arundel County. On Wednesday, Judge Martha Rasin ordered her held on \$50,000 bail at the county detention center.

Renee Thieme told the judge she had been undergoing therapy in Pennsylvania for a drinking problem and intended to continue therapy here.

Rasin said Renee Thieme must stay away from her husband and abstain from using alcohol.
