The Baltimore speakers will inclde Rev. John, Roach Straton, Rev. Peter Aioslie, Dr. J. William Finck, Attorney John Grill, Mrs. Emma Maddox-Finck, Mrs. Mary B. Holton, D. Flora Pollack, Mrs. Mary Haslup and Mrs. Melva Coswell.

The meeting will be in charge of Miss Etta Maddox, the author of the bill The delegation left Baltimore at 1 o'clock on a special train over the Short Line. Each member wore a button with the slogan "Equal Rights

for All."

Tonight there will be a big meeting in the House of Delegates, when the Rev. Anna B. Shaw and Miss Belle Kearney will speak. The public is invited.
