I, Robert M. McLane, of the City of Baltimore, in the State of Maryland, do make this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all other wills and Testaments heretofore made by me.

To Leda Hewson, Mary Costello, and Mary Irving (colored), — who have lived with my family for many years — I give the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, One Hundred Dollars, and One Hundred Dollars, respectively, in case they be living at the time of my death. But the legacy of any one of them who may have died before me, shall form part of my residuary estate.

To my brother, Allan McLane, I give all my household furniture which is in storage at the time of my death.

To my Father and Mother, or the survivor of them, I give all my books and personal effects other than the household furniture given to my brother Allan.


To Mary Van Ribber, widow of

The late Dr. John Van Bibber, of Baltimore,
I give the sum of Ten Thousand
dollars (10,000.⁰⁰), in case she be living
at the time of my death. But if
she be not living at the time of my
death, then this legacy shall form
part of my residuary estate.

All the rest and residue of
my estate I give to my sisters, Fanny
King Mc Lane and Frederica Cor Mc Lane,
share and share alike.

I appoint my Father, James L.
Mc Lane, or, in case he do not survive
me, then my brother, Allan Mc Lane,
executor of this my last will and
testament. And I request that such
executor be not required to give bond.
