

THE STATE OF MARYLAND.

Affairs at Annapolis—Happenings in the Counties.

ANNAPOLIS, July 18.—Gov. Lloyd has designated the following additional persons to represent Maryland in the Farmers' National Congress, which meets at Minneapolis, Minn., August 23: First congressional district, Col. James Wallace, Col. William McKesney; second district, Col. Wilmot Johnson, Hon. J. Carroll Walsh; third district, to be supplied; fourth district, Oliver N. Bryan, and another to be supplied; sixth district, Hon. Lloyd Lowndes, Outerbridge Hursey.

Jacob H. Zook has been appointed justice of the peace for the Hagerstown district of Washington county, vice William McK. Kenpler, failed to qualify.

Post-office Inspector Ryan inspected the Annapolis post-office today and found it in good shape. It was the first visit of this official to the Annapolis office.
