

WOMEN TO TOUR SOVIET

Six U. S. Medical Scientists Will Visit for a Month

WASHINGTON, March 5—Six American women in the field of medical science will tour medical institutions in the Soviet Union for a month this spring, the National Academy of Sciences announced today.

The visit, arranged in co-operation with the Rockefeller Foundation, the American Medical Association and the American Medical Women's Association, is part of an exchange agreement between the State Department and the Soviet. Last October six Soviet women scientists visited medical institutions in this country.

The United States delegation will be headed by Dr. Helen B. Taussig of Johns Hopkins University Hospital in Baltimore. Other members are Dr. Leona Baumgartner, Commissioner of Health of New York City; Dr. Thelma B. Dunn of the National Institutes of Health, Bethesda, Md.; Dr. Jean Henley of the College of Physicians and Surgeons, Columbia University; Dr. Esther C. Marting of the University of Cincinnati School of Medicine, and Dr. Margaret H. Sloan of the National Academy of Sciences.
