

SENTENCED FOR CRIME.

Henson to Be Hanged—Other Convicts to the Penitentiary.

ELLCOTT CITY, MD., April 2.—Jacob Henson, Jr., colored, was sentenced to be hanged today for killing Daniel F. Shea. It was the first time Judge I. Thomas Jones had ever imposed the death sentence. When asked by the court if he had anything to say, Henson replied that the jury did not give him a fair trial and the court did not, by any means give him justice. The prisoner's counsel will make an appeal to Governor Brown for executive clemency.

Other sentences were imposed as follows: Wm. G. Gore, colored, for car-breaking, ten years in the penitentiary—seven years in the first case, one year in the second and two years in the third.

York Butler, colored, for attempting to poison Lewis Meyers, three years in the penitentiary.

George W. Coates, colored, for murder in the second degree in killing Isaac Scoggins, also colored, eight years in the penitentiary.
