

MOB'S ACT IS DEPLORED

Residents Of Brooklyn Say Trouble Came From Fairfield.

Residents of Brooklyn greatly deplored the act of the mob in breaking into the jail. Yet while the police were trying to apprehend the members of the mob, they were not furnished with ready information.
